### ORDINANCE

An ordinance entitled an ordinance prohibiting chickens and other fowls from running at large within the corporate limits of the City of Matador prescribing a penalty for the violation thereof and declaring an emergency. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MATADOR.

That hereafter it shall be unlawful for the owner or custodian of any chicken or chickens or other fowls of any description to permit or allow them to run at large within the corporate limits of the city of Matador.

Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction shall be fined in any sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 and each day that such fowls as are enumerated above shall be permitted to run at large in violation of this ordinance shall be deemed to be a separate offense.

The fact that there is no ordinance prohibiting fowls from depredateing up on the flowers, garden and yards of the property owners within the city of Matador creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule to be read on three several days be suspended and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on and after its passage and publication and said rule is hereby suspended and so it is enacted. Passed the 4th day of May 1925.

**SPEAKERS FOR TEACHERS ASSOCIATION**

Fort Worth, Tex. May 25:— Three of the principal speakers have been engaged for the November convention of the Texas State Teachers Association, according to Lee Clark of Gainville, president of the Association. Others are expected soon to accept places. Those who have accepted are Royal B. Farnum, director of art education for Massachusetts; Eugene T. Lies of the National Playground Association, Chicago, and A. F. Herman, superintendent of schools of Montgomery County Alabama. The convention will be held in Dallas Nov. 27, 28 and 29.

**Bad Name is Undeserved.**  
Living for more than a century under the stigma of being cannibals and without religion, the Yaggan Indians of Tierra del Fuego, or "Fireland," the southernmost inhabited land of the globe, have been revealed as a moral people, never guilty of cannibalism and possessing a highly developed religion and a beautiful language. This knowledge was obtained through the investigations of Father William Koppers and Father P. M. Gusinde, vice president of the Philological museum at Santiago, Chile. Ironically, the true story of the Yaggan's civilization comes as they are about to join the world's extinct peoples. Fifty years ago the tribe numbered some 2,000. Today it does not exceed 70 persons. It was Darwin who gave the Yaggan their bad name.

**Scientists Discover New Animal.**  
Add a new animal to the list of those known to man. Prof. I. L. Woodruff of Yale university is the discoverer. His find is one of the one-celled forms known as protozoa, which are so small that they cannot be seen without the aid of a microscope. This tiny form is about one two-hundredths of an inch long and less than one-fourth as wide, and Professor Woodruff has named it Paramoecium polycaryum. It moves about rapidly in a drop of water by means of hair-like projections, called cilia, over its body; these cilia beat the water with whip-like strokes. Paramoecium's food consists chiefly of bacteria and smaller protozoa.—Science Service.

**Land for National Forests.**  
The National Forest Reservation commission has authorized the purchase of 11,457 acres in eight eastern states for national forest purposes at an average price of \$3.95 an acre, according to the forest service, United States Department of Agriculture. The most significant purchase consists of ten parcels with a total area of 5,300 acres in McKean, Forest, and Warren counties, Pennsylvania, within the Allegheny National forest. The area now being acquired by the government on the headwaters of the Allegheny river is nearly 110,000 acres.

**Whale Steaks Become Popular.**  
Canned North Pacific whale steaks are the newest delicacy in England, France and Italy, and virtually the entire pack of last season has been disposed of, according to word received at Tacoma by packers from jobbers in the European centers. Cooked perfectly in the can to a great degree of tenderness, the tinned sea-beef is making friends with epicures wherever introduced. This season's pack will consequently be a heavy one. Packers who have investigated now anticipate a good whale crop.

**SEASONABLE GOOD THINGS**

**THOSE** who are fond of the flavor of coffee will like Coffee Ice Cream.  
Beat the yolks of six eggs until light and add one cupful and a half of sugar, then beat again; add to one quart of milk scalded in a double boiler and cook carefully until the mixture coats the spoon; now add two-thirds of a cupful of strong black coffee, cool and freeze. Serve with sliced nuts and Butterscotch Sauce.  
Cook over hot water one cupful each of sugar, cream, and dark corn sirup; cook one hour. Add a tablespoonful of vanilla extract and serve.

**Fruit Punch**

Grate a pineapple and boil with a quart of water for fifteen minutes; strain and cool. Boil four cupfuls of sugar with two cupfuls of water five minutes, cool, and add this sirup to the pineapple water, add the juice of six lemons, ten oranges, two grapefruit, one quart of strawberries cut in halves, two sliced bananas, one cucumber sliced, peeling and all; four quarts of water, two sprigs of mint and one cupful of fresh-made tea. Cover close and let stand to chill for two hours. Everbearing strawberries are used for this.

**Codfish Cakes**

Take one cupful of codfish flakes, one cupful of diced raw potatoes, cook together and mash, add one tablespoonful of butter, the same of milk or cream, one beaten egg. Drop by spoonfuls into hot fat and fry brown.

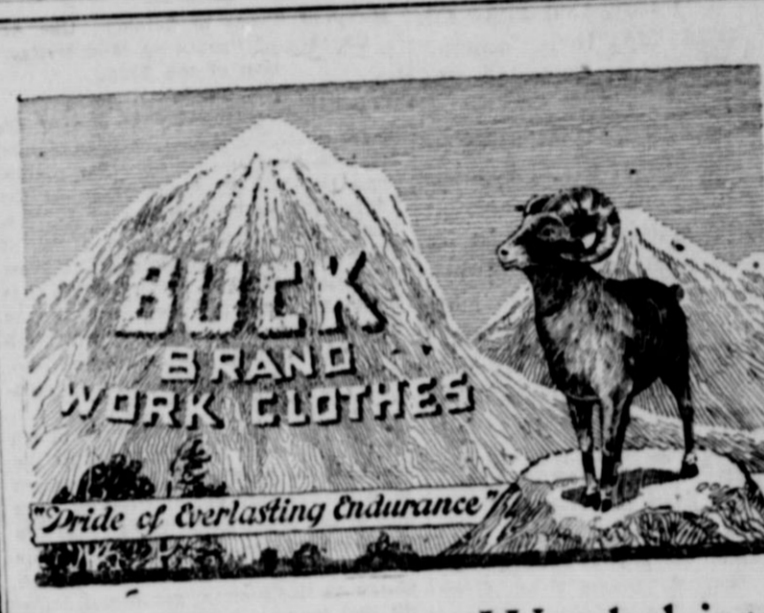

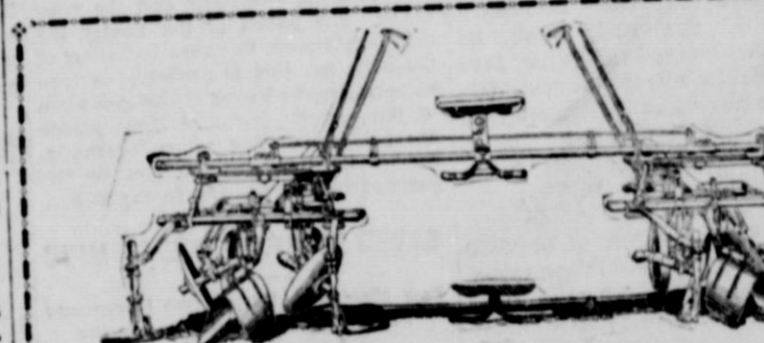

### ORGANIC MATTER PUTS LIFE INTO SOILS

It is true, that some soil shows more life than others," says F. M. Bainer, Director, The Southwestern Wheat Improvement Association. Continuing he says: "The life of a soil depends to a large extent on the amount of organic matter or humus it contains. New soils are always well supplied with organic matter and unless provision is made to maintain this supply, it will gradually decrease and the crop yield will become poorer and poorer. A soil deficient in organic matter lacks fertility, it has nothing to hold it together, it bakes and blows and is very hard to handle. In many sections of the Southwest, more than fifty per cent of the original matter has already been lost.

"A soil that is well supplied with organic matter will retain more moisture than one having a low supply, thus helping to carry crops thru periods of drouth. Organic matter improves the physical condition of the soil and makes all tillage operations easier, it also reduces baking, cracking, washing and blowing. Organic matter furnishes food for the necessary bacteria of the soil, such as those that change nitrogen into the available nitrate form. Organic matter and nitrogen go hand in hand and when one is deficient, the same thing is usually true of the other. A soil is known for its fertility in proportion to the amount of organic matter and nitrogen it contains. Low yields and poor quality of crops are, therefore, largely due to a deficiency of these two elements.

"Too much of the one-crop system, such as producing wheat year after year on the same land, is responsible for the loss of much of this organic matter. Much can be done towards restoring this fertility thru crop rotation systems that include some one of the legumes, such as alfalfa, clover, sweet clover, cowpeas and soybeans, and occasionally it is an excellent practice to plow under such crops, while they are still green. All crop residues, such as straw, stubble and stalks should be plowed under, rather than burned.

### SUPPLY OF TIMBER ASSURED

With Proper Management, Coeur d'Alene National Forest Can Furnish Millions of Feet Yearly.

Fifty million feet of sawlogs can be removed annually for all time from the Coeur d'Alene national forest, Idaho, according to the prescriptions of the management plan approved by the forest service, United States Department of Agriculture.

The net area of forest is about 680,000 acres, of which about 550,000 acres is considered as productive forest land. The great share of the timber, as noted, is in two age classes, the mature and overmature class and the very young, 0 to 20-year, class.

The main problem of management is that of making the mature timber last for a sufficient period to enable the youngest and intermediate classes to reach maturity. This average period is estimated at 80 years, during which time a total of 4,000,000,000 feet will be removed, or an average of 50,000,000 feet per year.

### PLANTS THAT ARE POISONOUS

Many of These in Common Use Are Capable of Producing Mild Irritation of the Skin.

Although poison ivy is one of the worst offenders, it frequently is blamed for poisoning caused by other plants, says Dr. W. W. Stockberger of the United States Department of Agriculture. The department has a list of more than 100 such plants that grow in this country, and it is probable that there are others that may be poisonous to some persons. Not all of these plants are equally poisonous, and, too, there is great variation in the susceptibility of persons.

Because some of these common plants are used for ornament in the home is no reason to fear them, as most persons are not affected by them and in the great majority of cases the irritation of the skin is mild. This would probably hold true of such plants as the tomato, geranium, daffodil and many others that are known to cause skin poisoning. Such plants, though, as the nettles are irritating to most persons.

In the long list of plants having these toxic properties are the following, which are well known, but not all of them generally known to be poisonous: Aconite, allanthurus, asparagus, castilla, dog fennel, lady's slipper, wild carrot, hop, lobelia, oleander, nightshade, oxeye daisy, pansy, pokeweed, smartweed, primula, buttercup, poison elder or poison dogwood, bloodroot, mullein, cocklebur and the mustard. The pollen of the Easter lily has been known to cause irritation of the skin, but this is probably as rare as poisoning by leaves of the geranium or the carrot. Some of these plants are poisonous when taken internally, but the list has been made out on the basis of being irritating to the skin.

### SAVED BY PRESENCE OF MIND

Few Men Would Have the Nerve and Patience of George, Though the Emergency Was Great.
