Dr. J. F. Hughes, president of the Roaring Springs School Board, said today that if the loan is granted that it was believed work on the school building could be started in six to eight weeks. Immediate relief for unemployment being the major purpose of the gigantic measure.

It is estimated that at least \$250,000,000 can be secured for Texas from this enormous Federal fund if prompt action is taken by these in a position to negotiate loans covering eligiable projects.

On acceptable projects the Federal Government will make an outright grant or gift of 30 per cent of the construction cost, and will loan the balance of 70 per cent at a low rate of interest.

A meeting was held by the Roar-Springs School Board and local business men in the Masonic Building Monday night, where application was made for a loan to build new school buildings here.


