Permanent Agent Will Relieve L. L. Ballard Now In Charge

Motley county will again have a permanent Agricultural Agent as soon as an appointment from the Commissioners Court, by John Ed-& M. College

Cooperation of the Texas A. & M College makes possible the services of a county agent for Motley county.

The step to include part payment of the agents salary in a budget prepared by the Commissioners Court was made necessary by the impossibility of counties without agents to participate in the Federal two-year Cotton and Wheat reduction plan. With the services of an agent Motley county is now assured between \$125,000 and \$140,000 in cash rental per year for the two ensuing years, which would have

otherwise been impossible. Emergency Agricultural Assistant, L. L. Ballard, who has charge of the cotton plow-up check distribution in the county, will be relieved of his duties upon arrival of the permanent agent.
