### Free Poison **Aid Farmers Hopper Fight**

Serious Damage Seen As Insects Advance Into Fields Here

Distribution of free poison bait to fight the growing grasshopper menace was begun Wednesday, according to Frank A. Buckley, county agent, who is in charge of the program. Liquid sodium arsenite and wheat bran are the only materials furnishel by the United States Department of Agriculture. Farmers wishing to participate in the free bait must furnish an equal quantity of bran or cotton seed hulls and any other ingredients which they care to add, such as amyl acetate and sorghum molasses.

Applications for the free materials are taken at the County Agents office and delivery is made at the cettonseed house of the Farmers' Cooperative Gin at Matador. Joe Berry Meador is in charge of delivery of materials at




