Upper terminal part of plants wilt: young leaves are chlorotic near the base, and tips burn; small grains have twisted leaves, and tips die. In one field where a copper deficiency was evident, plants under an electric line received enough copper from the rainfall coming into contact with the copper lines to correct the deficiency.

Copper will build up where Bordeau sprays are used, and continued regular applications can build this amount up to the toxic point. If copper is determined to be deficient, Foliar sprays may be used, as well as chelates.
