AUSTIN, Nov. 23.—Belief that the statewide average assistance grant would be larger under the new statute than the \$16 of the old law, was exprssed today by Acting Director Orville S. Carpenter, of the Texas Old Age Assistance Commission. He said he expected this trend to become apparent about the first of next year "Experiences of other states indicate that a 'needy only' program generally results in a higher aver-

age grant," Carpented stated. "The present Texas average of \$16 is influenced by small allotments made under the old law to people barely meeting statutory

"Applicants and recipients needing only small grants now will be put on the rolls, of course, but I believe we will have fewer of them," he added.




