Dear Ben:

I guess we can all get along though. Everyone here says a crew wouldn't be complete without a Texan on it. I don't think it would either! The Copilot is from Goldsboro, N. C. I believe that is where Raymond Rattan is stationed. The pilot and bombardier are both from Houston, Texas. I am the tail gunner myself.

I don't have a y more news today, but sure would like to have some news from good old Matador. Hoping to be home again soon.
