These shortages were due to the fraudulent manipulation of the pump so as to divert the flow of the gasoline to the underground storage tank at the same time the car was served, according to Mr V. A. Stovall, Director of Weights and Measures. While it is true, sta ted Mr. Stovall that this act of diverting the gasoline can be accon plished on nine different types of pumps now in use in Texas, it equally true that there are pump in use in Texas; which cannot b manipulated to divert the flow of gasoline anit are as accurate a any pump made. It was explained that there is no law to compel the owner of a pump which may be manpiulated to commit fraud, to discontinue its use. If such a pum shows to be correct on a test must be sealed as correct unde our present statute, yet in fifteen utes after it is sealed as con rect a purchaser may be shorted out of half of his purchase by the simple operation of opening a valve y NEA Service. 


