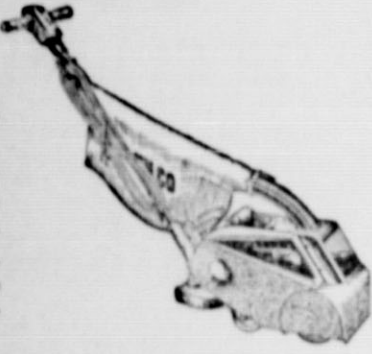

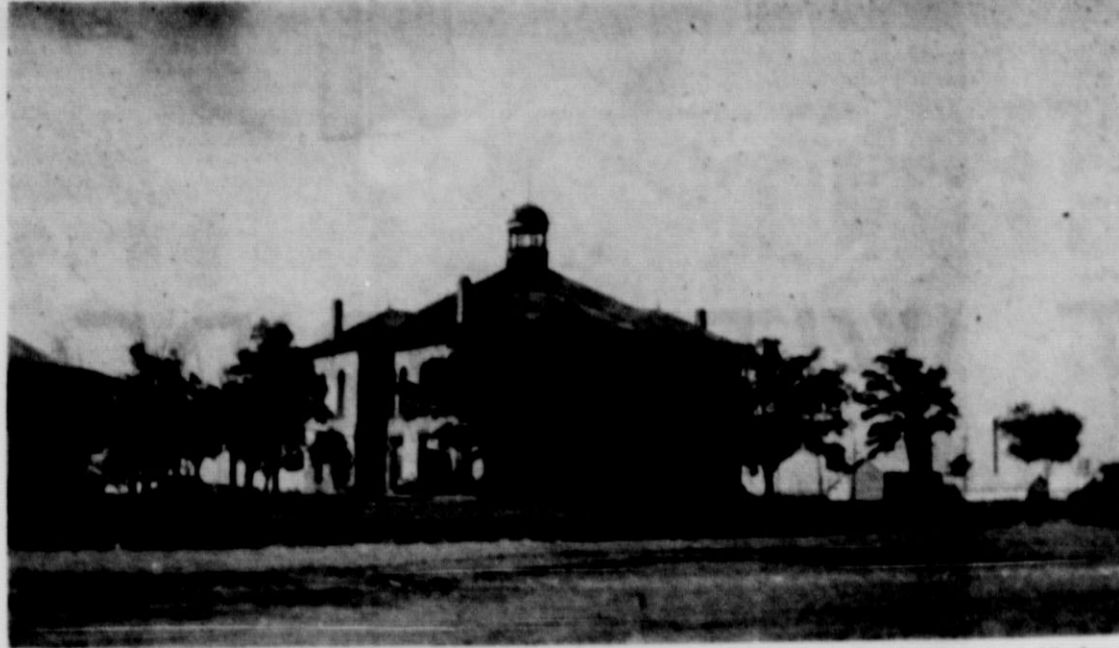

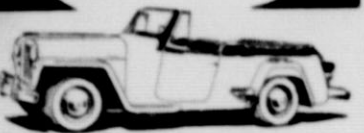


**FIRE IN THE RAINY DAWN** of Wednesday, September 27, 1944, destroyed the above Motley county courthouse. Flames were first discovered in the second story at 7:10 a. m. Origin of the fire is still unknown. A cornerstone located in the northeast corner of the building bore cated and the cornerstone placed, the building was destroyed by fire. The courthouse cost \$25,000. It was built almost entirely of native materials, bricks for the inner walls being burned on Tee Pee creek and lime burned on Salt creek three miles west of town. The sandstone used in the building was from Ring Cove canyon near Quitaque. Photo courtesy Mrs. R. A. Day the following inscription: "September 27, 1904. J. A. White, architect and builder. T. T. Bouldin, county judge; M. L. Patton, commissioner of Precinct 1; W. R. Tilson, commissioner of Precinct 2; J. R. Williams, commissioner of Precinct 3; C. D. Bird, commissioner of Precinct 4; and W.
