



AUSTIN, Sept. 29 - Average old age grants for October in a month, a statement of authorizations by the State Department of Public Welfare revealed to-

The October payment to old persons also will set a new record in total amount-\$5,945, 953. The higher payments are to be made in the face of increased recipients.

The old age rolls show a net gain of 795 for the month to total 197,924. Average checks will \$30.04, compared with \$29.98 for September.

Distribution to needy blind persons will average \$33.48 for October, which is a 10 per cent increase over September grants. Blind rolls also increased for the month, going from 5,428 to 5, 461 persons. Total distribution will be \$182,830 for the blind. The children's aid program will increase also, though the
