Restore Value Of Present Pavement

EQUIPMENT and materials to apply a sealcoat on Matador's existing paying are on hand awaiting final arrangements to start the project. Sheppard & Luce Co., contractors, will do the work which will correct faults and restore value to the \$57,000 paving project completed three years ago.

Business section of the old paving will not receive the sealcoat application, since it had previously been treated and is

considered in fair condition. Members of the contracting firm expects to complete the project in two or three days. The city has stock piles of small rock for the job estimated to be sufficient. Cost of asphalt and application is estimated in the neighborhood of \$4,000.

City officials believe financing of the project can be done out of existing funds (about \$2,000 out of the general fund and the same amount out of the water-Matador's new \$10,000 fire works fund) without causing truck will be delivered next too much strain on the budget.






