To time spray applications for casebearer control, first check for eggs on a daily basis are usually found on the tips ot nutlets and are about the size of the ball in a ball-point pen. The
eggs are white when first laid, then furn red over a three-to-five day period before turning white again after hatching.
Apply an insecticide the third day after the first eggs hatch to kill the larvae before they enter the nutlets. Since the larvae will hatch over a week-
long period or more, a second spraying may be necessary. Insecticides recommended for casebearer control include diazinon, Pydrin, malathion and Zolone.
