Motley County Commissioners met Monday, June 10 at the Motley County Courthouse for Their regular monthly meeting Those prenh Were Billy Hand ers Bill Washington, Billy Hand Judge Billy Joe Whitaker and Juge Bily Jo Wint Clerk Lucretia The Motley County Clerk Lucretia Campell audit was presented at the beginning of the meeting. Following this, the commis ers reviewed the bills for the month to be paid, totaling approximately $\$ 9,000$ Approximately $\$ 491.44$ for library expenses, approximately $\$ 362.74$ for sheriff's office, approximately $\$ 3,372.70$ miscellaneous and approximately $\$ 1582$ for Precinct I, $\$ 1489.96$ Precinct II, $\$ 368.59$ Precinct III and $\$ 1253.65$ Precinct V. Each bill was read aloud and discussed by the court. Treasurer's Report, Sheriff's
Report, Justice of the Peace Report, Justice of the Peace Report and Library Report wer all given to each commissione
