as early as next month．
A tentative agreement was reached this past week in
meetinas with the Public Utility meetings with the Public Utility Commission staff in Austin，and the matter is expected to go before the Commission July 26 for a final order hearing．That
would be just in time for the refunds to go on the August bills for all of WTU＇s retail customers． The full amount to be million．This is an increase of $\$ 3.9$ million over the amount in WTU＇s original request，which included only fuel costs savings achieved from August 1984 through May 1985.

The new figure includes savinas made in June and an additional $\$ 2.3$ million reoresenting a lump refund of fuel cost savings balance，plus interest，realized before last
Auaust．Refund of those total Auaust．Refund of those total savinas had begun in mid－ November and were scheduled 1985. WTU estimates that the total refund now will result in a $\$ 41$ credit to the average residential
customer＇s bill．The refund is customer＇s bill．The refund is
made possibie by WTU being made possibie by WTU being
able to spend less for power plant boiler fuel than was plant boiler fuel than was
anticipated when fuel costs factors were set by the PUC last fall．

Former customers will not receive refunds．The reasoning is that if the former customers had been undercharged for fuel， ther could not be billed in the
