Brandt Bearden: Honorable Mention Flanker. Led team in receptions; led team in reception yardage; led team in scoring receptions.

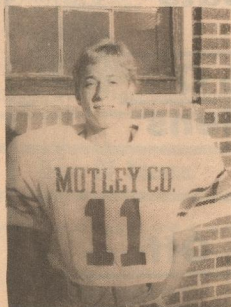

David Stafford: 6'0", 235 lb. Freshman.

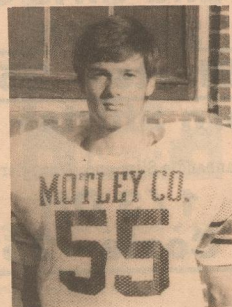
Honorable Mention offensive tackle. Led team in run blocking percentage; led team in upper body strength tests.

"Although I was disappointed in our lack of victories this season, I felt the team showed marked improvements in many areas compared to the last few seasons. The

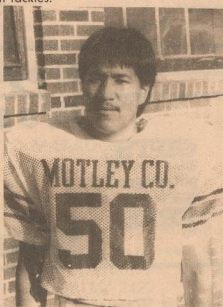
