lower blood pressure than those who don't according to a recent study of approximately 15,000 Harvard male alumni. Sedentary alumni had a 35 percent
reater chance of developing hypertengreater chance of developing hyperten-

lower blood pressure, and effects that were independent of body weight. Still another study found the rclative risk of hypertension about one and half times
greater in sedentary individuals than in greater in sedentary ind

desirable changes in body weight, body composition, or by stress reduction. The question arises as to whether regularexer-
