





City Water Tower gets new paint job

The Matador City Council met at 6:30 p.m. December 10, at City Hall with a quorum consisting of Mayor Pat Smith and Councilmen Pat Seigler, Shane Jones, Alvin Alexander, and Chuck Ream. Also in attendance were City Secretary Debra Scott and City Superintendent Steve Barton. Councilwoman Kay Bailey was absent. No one spoke in Open Forum.

In opening comments, Mayor Pat Smith recognized the accomplishment of Joel Guerrero who recently completed week-long classes in Lubbock to earn Class D Water Operator status. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) requires that public water maintenance be conducted by licensed operators.

City Superintendent Steve Barton reported that Water Tower Maintenance, Inc. had completed painting the interior and exterior of the water tower. A decision was made to change the color from silver to white, consisting of a coat of primer as well as paint, Barton said. The additional coats of paint will make the tower exterior less prone to deterioration due to weather. In a council meeting last May, the council discussed having

County Matadors. The low bid of \$22,678 was presented by Water Tower Maintenance, Inc. with the cost of additional lettering on the tower from \$2,000 to \$5,000. The letters would be about 2-foot tall in vinyl. At present, adding lettering on the tower is still pending.

City Secretary Debra Scott reported that the insurance reimbursement on the fire damage to the Gonzales property on north Main Street was still pending. The property, specifically a carport, received fire damage during clean-up of the Skaggs property located directly south of the Gonzales property. Scott said the insurance company has not received all the information they needed from the adjuster in order to complete the settlement.

The Council has been reviewing an example Investment Policy for the City. This action item was tabled by a motion from Chuck Ream, seconded by Shane Jones. "We need a policy in effect before we renew banking policies next fall," Debra Scott said, adding, "then the policy will need to be reviewed year-

In the City Secretary Report, Scott reported that following contact with the State Comptroller's office, the City 'State Football Champions may qualify for more than sideration will include the 2007" emboldened on the \$20,000 for City Hall repair. water tower to honor the ac- According to Scott, the Compcomplishment of the Motley troller's Office said a lot of cit-

ies did not apply for the funds, making more money available for cities that need major repairs. Scott received a new window bid of \$8,000 for 14 windows upstairs, and \$3,400 for windows downstairs. An additional \$8,600 was quoted for adding foam to the interior walls for insulation.

In addition, according to Scott, the insurance reimbursement on the recent hail damage was \$8,911.00. There is an overage of about \$1,300 that can be used for "some type of interior repair," Scott said. The council then discussed using the additional funds to repair the ceiling and/or floors of the upstairs apartment above City Hall. Councilman Chuck Ream asked the Secretary to obtain an estimate and report back to full council.

In the Financial Report, the City Secretary reported that the Water Works Fund on income was about 67 percent. "I am real pleased with the efficiency of our landfill," Scott

In other business, employee bonuses were discussed, and a motion was made by Councilman Pat Seigler to raise the bonuses from \$250.00 to \$300.00. This motion passed unanimously.

Everyone is invited and welcome to attend both performances. These wonderful Christmas presentations are sure to bring a blessing to all who attend





Doctor Yourself... With Water

Healthy Living for a Healthy Planet

We've all heard it. Drink more water. But how seriously do we take that advice? And how often do we look to water first when we're feeling out of sorts, sick, or learn we have a disease. Let's take a closer look.

Water is the main ingredient in our body. If we think about our body as a machine, it's composed mostly of water (over 70%). To run optimally, we need to fuel up our bodies with plenty of water every day, starting first thing in the morning (before coffee!).

While water is our most important nutrient, our body reacts different to water than any other food or drink. So although there might be some water content in the food and drinks we consume, they are no substitute for water (including juice). In fact, caffeinated beverages actually dehydrate us by causing us to excrete more fluid than we consumed. This means that if we consume caffeinated beverages (coffee, tea, soda, energy drinks), we need to make sure to make up for that water loss with extra water consumption.

Unfortunately, water is often contaminated with chemicals in this industrial age. It is important to filter water before we drink it to avoid consuming microbes, pesticides, metals, chlorine, fluoride, and

other toxins. Think bottled water is free from these contaminants? Think again. Water bottled in plastic may have all of the above plus plastic, which disrupts our hormonal and reproductive systems. The bottled water industry is also environmentally harmful due to the resources used during extraction, bottling, transportation, and waste. All of these are great reasons to choose tap water and use a safe reusable water bottle made of stainless steel or glass.

This season, as we indulge in holiday goodies, remember to drink plenty of water. For optimal hydration, consume about half your weight in ounces of water per day or follow these guidelines:

About 2 glasses of water (1 glass=8 ounces) on waking in morning.

1 to 2 glasses of water 1/2 hour before meals. 1 glass of water 2-1/2 hours

after a meal.

Other plain water during day as needed.




Seniors: Jaci Zingerman-Main Dish and Alexis Osborn-Fruit and Vegetables.

Disease may play role in quail decline

SAN ANGELO - Disease may be playing a role in the demise of Texas quail, said a Texas AgriLife Extension Service expert.

Quail season has been disappointing," said Dr. Dale Rollins, AgriLife Extension wildlife specialist at San Angelo. "By Texas standards, wild quail hunting has been sub-par since 2006, and I'm wondering if disease might not be part of the puzzle. Certainly, it's probably not the key reason, but I'm starting to suspect it may be a contributing factor."

Rollins said coccidiosis (malady caused by parasitic protozoans of the digestive system) is often blamed, but exactly what disease might be behind the drop in quail populations, or even if there is a disease contributing to the problem, is currently unknown. He said there are other potential threats, including West Nile Virus, avian influenza, avian cholera and avian tuberculosis that may be factors.

Sick quail don't last long before something eats them, so disease surveillance in wild quail is a tough proposition, according to Rollins.

"I've always been intrigued by the possible role disease plays in quail dynamics," Rollins said. "When you think about it, the birds offer a perfect biological fuse for disease spread among the population. They are social birds, and when a covey dwindles to less than about six birds. they go join another covey.

"Blue quail used to be common over areas as far east as Throckmorton, but they disappeared over much of their range in 1988; December 1988 to be exact in my opinion. While hunting in Crockett County that December, I dressed several birds with spotted livers, but didn't think much of it. I just took some photographs and discarded the birds. Within months, blue quail had vanished as far west as the Pecos River. I can't explain such a die-off except by some mystery disease. Suffice it to say my antennae are

up for sick quail now." Rollins asks quail hunters to be on the lookout for sick quail this season. If birds taken are too light for their size or if a green discharge from the vent is spotted, he said it would be worth noting. He said to pay special attention to whether the liver has white or yellow nodules in it which are signs of a bacterial infection.

If disease is suspected, Rollins asks hunters to place the bird in a plastic zipper-type bag, refrigerate it and call him as soon as possible at 325-653-4576 or 325-776-2615.

Rollins is also the director of the 4,700-acre Rolling Plains Quail Research Ranch at Roby. He said they are currently livetrapping quail at the ranch for leg-banding to support a radio telemetry project. At the same time, they also are collecting samples for disease and parasite testing.

"We'll submit about 200 samples for screening of viral, bacterial and parasitic diseases," he said. "These data will help us better understand whether various diseases really are a factor.

"A separate research project on eye worms and intestinal parasites was started in September in collaboration with the Caesar Kleberg Wildlife Research Institute. Preliminary testing from quail collected on the research ranch last winter showed parasite infestation in the eyes, which may be noteworthy. When you're a bobwhite, you live on the edge as it is; any debilitating factor like worms under your eyelids can't be good.

"At the research ranch, we're seeking to unravel just what's happened to bobwhites and blue quail across much of the Rolling Plains," he said. "We've adopted a philosophy of 'leave no stone unturned.' So, we're investigating some heretofore

overlooked agents, namely disease and parasites to see if they possibly are playing a more than minor role in the demise of Texas quail."

Precautions for Animal Owners during Cold Weather

With winter setting in, there are a few simple precautions that you should take in order to protect your animals.

Make sure your animal has plenty of warm bedding. For livestock use hay, wood shavings, or straw. For pets use old blankets, store bought pet beds and if possible, put them up for the night in a covered area and offer a safe heat source.

Provide fresh water daily. In the winter time, people tend to neglect watering their animals due to colder weather. In the mornings, supply animals with fresh water and on days that temperatures do not rise above the freezing level, it is necessary to check water supplies throughout the day to make sure ice has not formed, blocking the water supply.

Provide your animal with plenty of food. Since food is a source of energy for animals, it is necessary during colder months for animals to have plenty of food to produce body heat in order to survive.

Animals immune systems can become weak during the winter months, so if your animal starts showing signs of sickness, contact your local veterinarian or county Extension agent as soon as possible.
