livestock nor poultry constituted "farm products" and w
therefore subject to property (ad valorem) taxation. Some taxing entities, such as school districts, have
imposed a tax on some livestock and poultry. Others have not. Some have studied the situation and, because of the difficulty of accurately counting livestock on the open range,
have concluded that it would cost them more to administer the program than they would receive in additional tax revenues.
