# Funnel Cloud Forms Sunday Gives City A Close Call

Matador has a close call Sunday evening when a funnel cloud formed suddenly at the western city limits and dipped low enough to tear down fences, trees and rip off part of a

shed roof and tear off shingles from houses. The funnel formed at Texas Highway 70 and about 7:50 p.m. and caused damage at the homes of Bennie Keltz, Kenny Barton, Danny James, George Ho-Gland, Ted Green, and at the Motley County

Earlier in the day, at approximately 5 p.m., the first of three storms rumbled through Motley County. From golfball to baseball size gottball to baseball size hail fell south of Matador and reached parts of Roaring Springs. There were some reports that hail as large as a softball fell near Roaring Springs

Springs.

"Most of the hail was "Most of the hail was small," Matador Fire Chief Rodney Williams said. "But some was big enough to cause damage."

Williams said firemen and Deportment of

and Department of Public Safety troopers spotted a tornado on the ground 10 miles northwest of Matador on the Birnie and Hill

Ranches.
"This was about 7:20
p.m." Williams said. "It
stayed on the ground
about two minutes. No damage was reported there."

dropped out of the clouds catching weather watchers by surprise. It began dipping and






