He spoke on various diseases and surgery of the eye, and showed a film, "Diabetes and the Eye," showing symptoms and treatment specifically of persons suffering from diabetes and hypoglycemia (low blood sugar). He explained that fluctuan ing sugar level affects laser treatment and laser trearment and other methods of advised that the patien should check with an optometrist or family doctor before taking any action.
