## Whitaker Re-Elected As County Judge

Motley County Judge Billy J. Whitaker was re-elected to his office by a 444 to 221 vote over challenger John M. "Sonny" Russell last Saturday in the 1982 Democratic primary. Only 685 voters turned out to cast ballots in the elections.

For County commissioner Precinct No. 4 Billy B. Hand won a spot on the November ballot with 105 to 64 votes over Thurman F. Watson.

Bill D. Washington was unopposed in the Commissioners Precinct No. 2 spot.

The voters favored U.S. Sen. Lloyd Bentsen more than 2-1 and tapped Mark White as their favorite for governor in Democratic polling.

Bentsen polled 389 to Joe Sullivan's 180. In the gubernatorial race, White took 290, Buddy

Temple 131, Bob Armstrong 110, Don Beagle 15 and Roy Allen Mayo and David L. Young each received 11.

State representative tallies were split 306 for Foster Whaley and 252 for Doyce Middlebrook.

## Services Held Saturday For Randall Whitworth

Funeral services for Jesse Randall (J. R.) Whitworth, 86, were conducted on Saturday, May 1 at 10:00 a.m. in the First United Methodist Church.

Officiating was Rev. Mark Rickman, pastor, and Rev. Roy Patterson, a retired Methodist Minister from Turkey. Burial was in the East Mound Cemetery under the direction of Seigler Funeral Home.

Mr. Whitworth was a native of Silverton. He was raised in Motley County. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army during World War I.

He started working for the First State Bank in 1924 serving as a Cashier and later as the assistant vice-president. He retired from banking in 1974 after 50 years.

Being well known around Matador, he enjoyed meeting people and then staying in contact with them, even though they moved to distant places. He often wrote short letters to everyone, especially the ones who went off to serve in the Armed Forces.

In an Amarillo paper in 1956, he was called the "kindest man in Matador". The editorial, in part went like this: "His achievements may not be well known out of his home county, but there he is known as the man who: Visits patients in the two Matador hospitals, every day. Buys more flowers than anyone in Matador, and is especially thoughtful about sending flowers to older people. Writes more letters than anyone in town, although his letter writing is not quite so heavy as it was during World War II when he wrote thousands of letters to Motley County servicemen all over the world. Has never refused to make a donation to any worthy cause."

He served as mayor for Matador, as the commander for the American Legion, as a steward of the First United Methodist Church. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge and a member of the Odd Fellows.

He served as secretary for 16 years for the Matador Lions Club. He also served as a president and was the only remaining active Chapter Member. In 1959, Lions International honored him for his

outstanding service to Lionism. At the time of his death, he had been a member for 53 years.

He was known as a one-man chamber of commerce in the Matador area.

He married the former Margaret Louise Caswell on August 10, 1925 in Bullard, Texas. She passed away on July 19, 1975.

Mr. Whitworth had lived in San Antonio for the past two years. He passed away on April 28, 1982, at 8:20 p.m. in the Audie L. Murphy

Memorial Veterans Hospital following a lengthy illness.

He is survived by one niece, Mrs. William C. (Burnell) Gruver of San Antonio; one nephew, Russell Surles of Dallas; six great nephews, William Surles, David Surles, Richard Surles, Fred Gruver, Stephen Gruver, and Lee Gruver; and one great niece, Judy Caswell. And by a town who will always remember what Randall Whitworth has done to make Matador a better place to live.

Roy Tippin of Matador has been recognized by the Board of Nurse Examiners as having met the qualification of Advanced Nurse Practitioner.

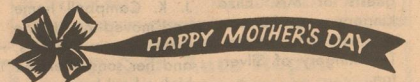

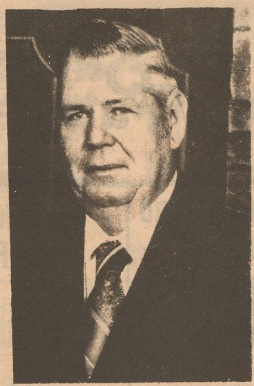

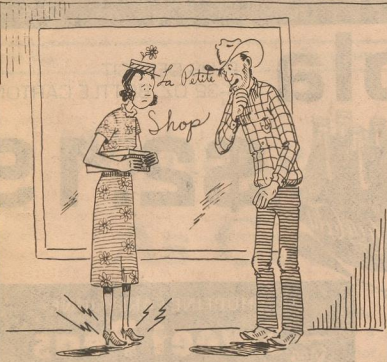
