He had left it running just in case.
Colquitt Warren and ina LaToska Williams were married by a Justice of the Peace in Kirtland in Childress County on August 24, 1924. Ina and Colquitt both graduated from Childress High School and both wanted to be teachers. Before they were married they searched for teaching jobs where they could teach together. The prospective employers were puzzled by the fact that these two young people were making application together until Ina and Colquitt revealed their future plans to marry in August before the school session began in
September. They found September. They found
employmentinatworoom school and senior high grades. and senior high grades.
Later they moved to where Colquitt owned and where Colquift owned and Company for over twenty years. Ina worked in the Court House where she acquired the title of Deputy Sheriff. She did the paper work required for the Sheriff's department, and it isn't known whether or not she ever arrested anyone...but she was prepared.
It was on a visit to a daughter then living in Carlsbad that Colquitt decided it was time for
another change in their lives. another change in their lives. He saw the property in Crow Flat and told Ina he wasn't going home, but was going to live
there. They homesteaded it, and built their home themselves. They have created a warm and
welcoming oasis to all who come welcoming oasis to all who come
to their gate. to their gate.
A few years later, Colquitt went back to college and taught himself to speak Spanish. Then he took up writing and has had
several stories published under the name of Tom Bean. the name of Tom Bean. week contributes to each Hudspeth County Herald, and in between times she is a marvelous needle person.

the Atlantic to ordain Francis
Asbury, a decision which
prompted the coming together
of various Methodist societies in
America to form the Methodist
Church. Sept. 18,1784 was the
date of Coke's sailing from Pill,
England, a tidewater port five
miles down the River Avon, from
Bristol, England.
Wyatt, a Methodist minister
known for his paintings of the
American West, flew to England
and stood on the river bank at
Pill to be able to make his
painting authentic. The river
itself has remained the same for
thousands of years and the
buildings in Pill are generally the
same as 200 years ago.
For his models in the painting,
Wyatt used members of the Tlia
First United Methodist Church,
with the exception of the figure
of John Wesley, who was
portrayed by Ervin Kern of
Jet
