## Randall Eddleman Owns Oil Company For A Day

| For about an hour one afternoon in July，students in a West Texas State University economics course either earned millions in the oil industry or experienced disappointment when they drilled＂dusters．＂ <br> The 10 students entered the oil business world as participants in a game of money and risk to help them learn about the business during＂Integrating Economics in the Classroom，＂an economics graduate course． <br> The course，taught by Dr． Allen Early，director of the WTSU Center for Economic Education，is designed to help area schoolteachers introduce economics to students at all grade levels and is offered during the second summer session． <br> Two representatives of Conoco Inc．，headquarters at Houston traveled to WTSU to | play＂Oil Is Where You Find It，＂a game developed by Conoco personnel to educate the public about the economics of the energy industry．The game was developed five years ago by Bill Newberry，formerly of Conoco＇s coordination and planning department，and Fred Beck of Conoco public relations department． <br> Introducing the game to the students were Dan Barth，a tubular specialist in the material management group who works with an annual inventory of $\$ 30$ million，and Paul Ludwig，a buyer in the material procurement group in the purchasing department．The visit to WTSU was Barth＇s first visit to a college campus to play the game and Ludwig＇s second． <br> ＂We just think the public needs to know our side and not just the negative which we tend | to hear much of the time，＂said Barth． <br> The game involves a box sectioned into 12 tracts．Each tract represents 60,000 square acres of federal offshore property for lease to oil companies． <br> Ludwig explained that there are more coal deposits than oil all over the world for energy use， but coal is dirty，nuclear energy is uncertain，hydroelectric power has hit a peak with the damming of rivers and wind energy is risky． <br> ＂We＇re still going to need and rely on oil for the next $20,30,40$ years，＂he said．＂Onshore reservoirs have been found and we have to go offshore and out of the United States．＂ <br> Each player receives $\$ 20$ million to bid on the land tracts and to drill holes for oil．Each player names his or her oil See Randall Eddleman，Page 4 |
