The tornado that ripped through Matador in May was one of the nine most devastating storms of that month, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration

In a recently issued report, the NOAA states that the storm registered an F3 on the Fujita Tornado Scale. An F3 twister is a severe tornado packing winds of 158 to 206 mph and causing heavy damage, according to the report. Only nine tornados reported that month were listed

The tornado proved to be more massive than at first believed. The report states the twister was 440 yards wide and traveled along a path eight

The report also confirms earlier beliefs that early warning provided by the National provided by the National Weather Service radar and

the tornado hit Matador May 1.
"Due to excellent warnings, no one was killed and only one person was injured," says the report which deals with the tornado and other severe weather phenomena in the United States.
Professor T. Theodore Fujita of the University of Chicago, who developed the scale, said F3 tornados usually tear off roofs, destroy some walls of well-

destroy some walls of well-constructed homes and have the ability to uproot large trees and

were destroyed, many roofs were ripped off and school buses were picked up and overturned. One of the largest structures in the city, the Motley County School, was completely destroyed.

destroyed.

According to the report, the system that spawned the tornado had a long and single life. It developed in northern Hale County and made a wide arc moving through Swisher, Briscoe, Floyd, and Motley Counties and then through Cottle, King, Knox and Haskell Counties. During much of its life span it moved at right angles to the upper wind flow.

Hail also was associated with the storm.

Between 7:30 and 8 p large hail was reported eight miles south of Silverton in Briscoe

The same storm produced severe winds to near 60 mph and golfball-sized hail in Dumont in King County at 9:50 p.m. CDT.

The tornado, nestled within the "super-thunderstorm," developed at 8:20 p.m. CDT as the storm crossed the Floyd-Motley County line. The National Weather Services began tracking the twister at that point tracking the twister at that point

The satellite pictures showed

"The satellite pictures showed rather well the tornado signature," the report states.

The first visual sighting of the tornado — five miles northwest of the city — was made at 8:44 p.m. CDT by Matador Fire

During the next eight minutes, residents of the city were warned, and most had enough warned, and most had enough time to either go to a shelter at the Motley County Courthouse or seek protection in a private shelter. Fifteen residents sought shelter in the basement of the Motley County School.

The report states the tornado struck the city at 8:52 p.m. CDT.
The tornado hit Motley County

School and then made a loop through a residential area before striking the school again. Then it moved into an open field about a mile south of the city where it dissipated. The storm

continued to move southeast.

The report says 27 homes were destroyed and 55 were damaged as the tornado moved through the city. Damage estimates were set at \$2.5 to \$3

same become due, said bonds to be issued in one or more series or be issued in one or more series or issues, to mature serially or otherwise not more than FORTY (40) years from their date, and to bear interest at such rate or rates (not to exceed the maximum rate permitted by law at the time of issuance of the bonds) as in its discretion the Board of Trustees shall determine?" shall determine?

All qualified voters in the school district will be permitted to vote. Polling places will be the Matador Courthouse, Flomot Community Center, Northfield Commity Center, and the Roaring Springs Depot.

The Motley County School was destroyed by a tornado on May 1, and federal funds have not been released to help rebuild
