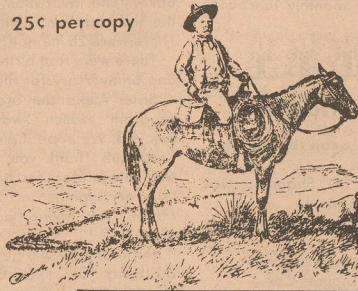

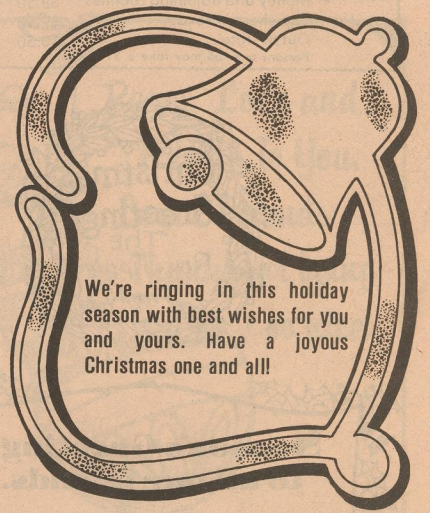

Lynda Elliott Fogerson Wins Professional Contest

Lynda Elliott Fogerson of Silverton, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Elliott of Matador, took

top honors in the professional division of the Make It Yourself with Wool Contest on the campus of Texas Womens University in Denton Saturday, Dec. 1.

The annual event sponsored by the American Sheep Producers Council and the Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association Auxiliary featured 40 winners from eight districts contests throughout the state in six divisions: pre-teen, junior, senior, adult, professional, and handwoven.

The purpose of the contest is to focus attention on the beauty and versatility of wool and to encourage the use of this fiber in sewing, knitting or crocheting garments.

Contestants are judged on pattern and fabric coordination, poise, suitability of garment for the contestant's age and activities, as well as the construction skill in making the garment. Mrs. Fogerson's ensemble featured a black chalk-stripe 100% wool suit made from an Yves St. Laurent designer pattern and accessorized with a red blouse.

Mrs. Fogerson is employed as the County Extension Agent for home economics in Briscoe County and teaches clothing construction workshops as a part of her job responsibilities.

The hen said, "Cluck, cluck, I told you the hay must be neat and clean."

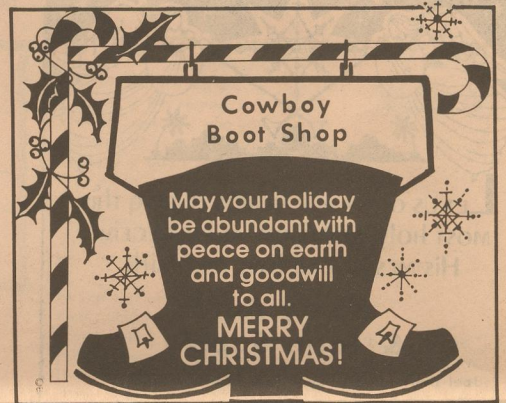

CHRISTMAS GOOSE



Glazed goose with apple stuffing for a memorable Christmas dinner.

Christmas past can make Christmas present special. One way to return to Christmas past is by preparing the traditional roast goose cooked to perfection and glazed with a special sweet and spicy ruby sauce.

The glaze is a variation of Cumberland sauce which is traditionally made with port wine. Cinzano Sweet Vermouth is substituted and blended with juices and spices.

heat and allow to cool for about 10 minutes. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Stuff cavity of goose with cooled stuffing and skewer closed. Place goose on rack in a roasting pan. Cook in preheated oven for 2-1/2 to 3 hours or until meat thermometer reads 185 degrees F. Carefully drain accumulating fat at least twice during cooking or as necessary. Discard fat. During the last 1/2 hour of cooking baste goose with Rosy Glaze (recipe below). Carve goose and arrange on serving platter with stuffing. Pass remaining glaze. Makes 4-6 servings.

ROSY GLAZED GOOSE WITH APPLE STUFFING

- 4 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 2 medium onions, chopped
- 2 ribs celery, sliced
- 1/2 cup Extra Dry Cinzano Vermouth
- 12 tart apples (about 2 1/2 pounds)
- 1-1/2 cups apple juice
- 1 bag (8 ounces) herb seasoned stuffing mix
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 10-12 pound goose or two 4-5 pound ducks

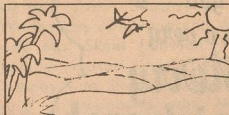
In a large skillet melt butter. Add onions and saute until limp, about 3 minutes. Add vermouth and simmer 10 minutes. Add apples and saute 5 minutes. Add apple juice, stuffing mix, salt and pepper stirring well to combine. Remove from

Glaze

- 1 cup orange juice
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 1/2 cup cranberry juice
- 3/4 cup Cinzano Sweet Vermouth
- 1 teaspoon mustard
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon onion powder
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1 jar (10 ounces) current jelly

In a small saucepot combine all ingredients. Heat over medium heat for 12 minutes or until mixture boils, stirring occasionally. Lower heat and simmer for 15 minutes.

Reserve glaze for basting goose during the last 1/2 hour of roasting. Reheat remaining glaze and serve with goose.

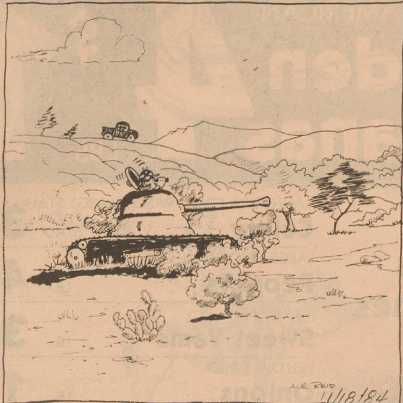
