The average cotton yield of Motley county as received from Washington, in Matador Monday, was 122 pounds of lint cotton per acre during a period of five years. Farmers in the sandy-land district about Roaring Springs, are being rated a higher average because of the better yield known to have been produced during drouthy years.

The Texas Almanac shows Motley county had 77,506 acres planted in cotton in 1930.






