However, after careful study of the cotton situation I find that South America is changing to longer staple cotton.
The better staple cotton we have, the
better market we will have for our 1937 crop and while we are short on staple cotton we have enough short cotton to last two years.
It looks like there will be a demand for every staple bale of cotton raised next year. The short cotton will then have to go to the speculator. yo you he will of fer you? have, but I do not believe it will be very much when he knows he will have to hold it two more years. I am just giving you my views as I have understood conditions. We have had seed tested from this territory, taking the best of the season, with this result: The test came back from Austin running from
If you don't have good seed we have Texas Special Big Boll Arcala about 40 percent lint yield staple 1-1-16 to $1-1 / 4$.
Government cotton scale as of Febstaple selling 270 points over 13 - 16 staple or $\$ 13.50$ per 500 lbs bale
