According to J. Fike Godfrey, WTCC Executive Vice President, the four biggest problems were (1) Government Regulations in General; (2) Inflation; (3) Taxes; and (4) Government Paperwork.

The survey shows that the next largest problems were rated as follows: (5) Insufficient Labor Supply; (6) Environmental Restrictions; (7) Labor Unions; (8) Minimum Wage Law; (9) Insufficient Depreciation Allowance; (10) Water Supply; (11) Crime; (12) Lack of Available Capital, and (13) Difficulty in Borrowing

Apparently Big Govern ment Bureaucracy is still the number one road block to more and better job and profit opportunities in West Texas," observed WTCC Executive Vice President Godfrey. ### **Move Started To Collect** Child Support Payments

The State Department of Public Welfare (DPW) hopes to collect \$291,600 in child support payments for welfare mothers in the 40-county Panhandle and South Plains regions, during fiscal 1976-77 according to Natalyn Collins,

DPW regional attorney. The department has established special child support collection units in a move to shift responsibility for support of children receiving public assistance back to the parents who are legally responsible for their support, she said.

Under an amendment to the Social Security Act that became effective last year, applicants for Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) must cooperate by identifying the parent who is not supporting the child, and assisting in locating that parent, if the child support payments are not being received. DPW uses state and federal parent locator services to find the parent in order to require payment. Only 2,230 of the state's 95,600 AFDC cases are in the

40-county area, according to October statistics. Most AFDC cases are mothers with children whose father has deserted them, or who fail to pay court-ordered child support after a divorce, or mothers of illegitimate children.

When child support payments are received for three months equaling or exceed-ing the amount of the welfare grant, the situation is considered sufficiently stable to remove the family from the welfare rolls. Average AFDC grants for a mother with three children is \$140.00

per month in Texas. Paternity suits may be filed in instances when the father refuses to voluntarily legitimate child and evidence supports the mother's claim. Two paternity suits have been filed to date in the 40-county area, both in Lubbock. Ms. Collins said more are expected to be filed in the near future. Fourteen instances of voluntary legitimation has been filed in the area, some involving more than one child, she said.



I also have copies of 'Agricultural Exemptions" put out by the Comptroller of Public Accounts. This leaflet lists items that should not have a sales tax on them. and a toll free number to call if you have additional questions. Let me know if you would like a copy.

I have mailed copies of the Farmers Tax Guide, 1977

edition to those who have requested it. Several changes have been made the last year, and if there are others who would like a copy, let me know as I have a few copies on hand.

Texas farmers and ranchers no longer have to pay sales taxes on certain purchases to be used in the production of food and fiber Effective July 20, the Texas sales tax law exempted agricultural producers from sales taxes on such items as bailing wire, fencing sup plies, and machinery and

equipment. However, a farmer or rancher does not automatically qualify for exemption from the sales tax. Producers must file an exemption certificate with each firm or business with which they deal. These certificates are available from the Comptroller of Public Accounts in Austin, or from local branch offices of the Comptroller.

To qualify for an exemption, the item purchased must be used exclusively on a farm or ranch. A farm or ranch is defined as land used entirely or partially in the production of crops, livestock or other agricultural products. Home gardens are not considered a

Certain items are exempt without the use of an exemption certificate. These include feed for farm and ranch animals, fertilizer, seeds and annual plants and animals.
