In a letter to interested county ASCS committeemen Price said, "I have visited at some length with officials of USDA and ASCS in Washington, D.C. concerning the proposed closing and merging of certain county ASCS offices in the 13th Congressional District. I have been assured that no county offices of ASCS will be closed prior to July 1st of this year." Price's comments came after several area newspapers re- | ported that nearly all the ASCS offices in the district would be merged before the end of 1974 "Articles have been published which are, at this time mis-leading, and it would appear that many people are accepting speculation for fact,' Price wrote.
