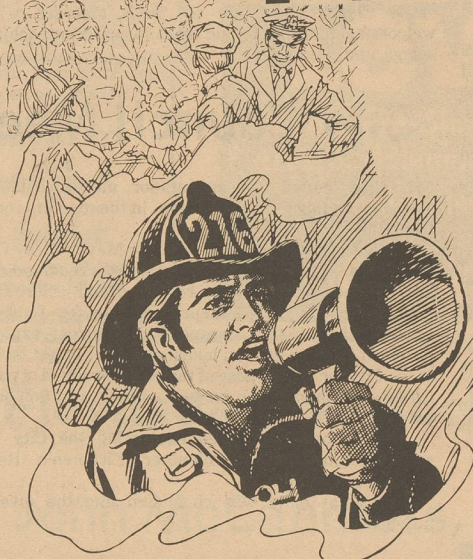

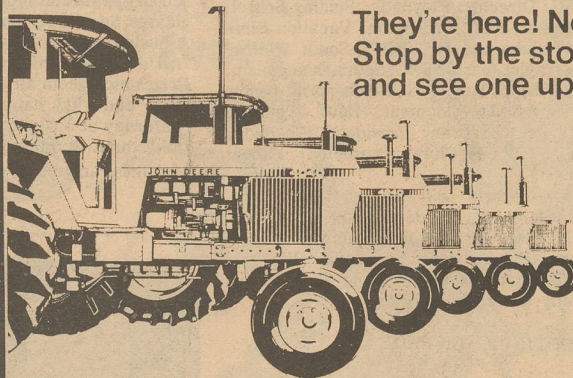

To see what could be done.

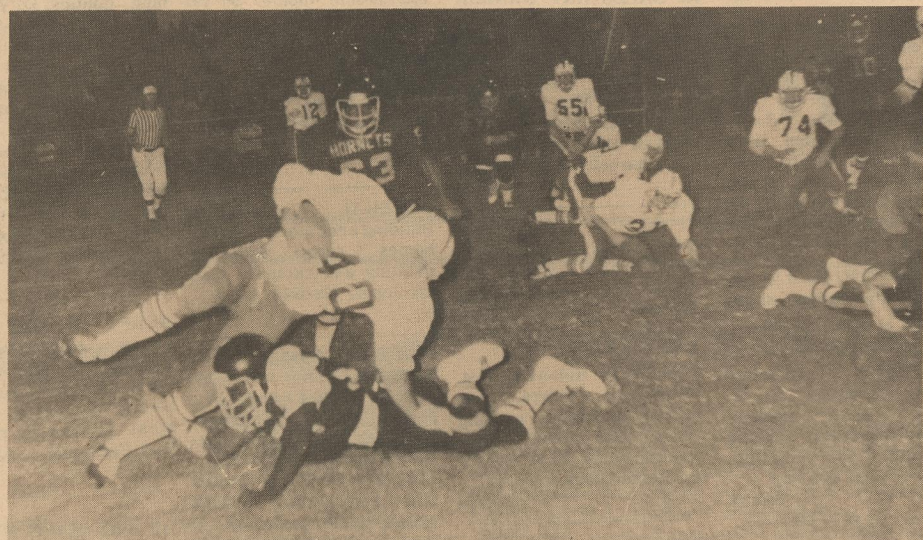
To start a project for the youth,

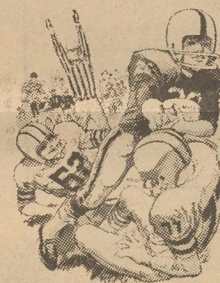
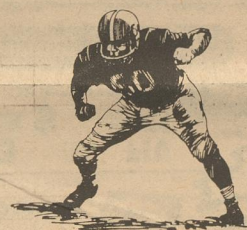

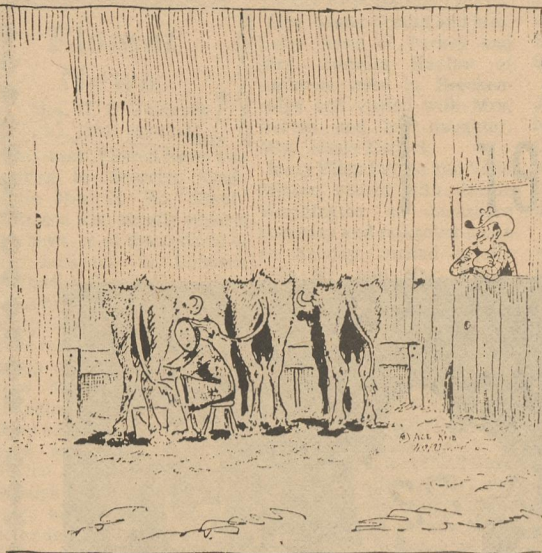
