COME TO CHURCH SUNDAY

Musical Drama Written By ACC Graduate To Be Feature Of Anniversary Pageant

ABILENE—Thirty-five minutes of original music by a young composer will be featured in Abilene Christian College's 50th anniversary historical pageant in February.

Robert Page of New York City a 1948 graduate of ACC, is the author of words and music for six musical selections to be used in the pageant, "A City Set on a Hill." The musical drama will be staged Feb. 16-18 and 20-23 as a major event in the college's current 50th anniversary celebration.

Page, now studying on a Danforth Foundation grant at New York University, made the arrangement of "Rock a My Soul," a negro spiritual, that is used by the world-famous Westminster Choir. He is now on leave from Eastern New Mexico University, Portales, where he is a member of the music faculty and director of the college choir.

While attending ACC Page was active in music and dramatic activities, directing two productions of a student musical, "Swanee." He has produced a new version of "Swanee" each year at ENMU since he joined the faculty of the school in 1951.

Depicting campus life and events during ACC's 50 years, he has written the following for the pageant:

"A City Set on a Hill," the introductory and closing number; "Let's Go for a Stroll Downtown," a musical comedy of the girls' dormitory life in 1918; "Fire on the Campus," a number on the 1929 fire which destroyed the old Administration Building; "The Beany Boys," a musical comedy depicting the student work system initiated in the 1930's; "A Wedding Hymn," story of the marriages resulting from friendships at ACC, and "What's Nicer than a Picnic?," a selection that tells of student life.
