Tax Rebate Checks Mailed

Tax rebate checks totaling \$24.8 million have been mailed out to 880 Texas cities as their October share of the city sales tax with Spearman receiving one for 33,084.79, it has been announced by State Comptroller Bob Bullock. Including the October check, Spearman has received \$74.402.87 compared to the \$37.980.67 received for the same period last year. Bullock in the Oct. 14 announcement noted that city sales tax rebates are running a healthy 20.8 per cent over last year.

"This is a pretty good indication of the strength of the Texas economy, and from an economic standpoint, things couldn't look better for the state." Bullock said.



Scholarship program announced

Friends of Animals, Inc., a New York-based national hu-mane conservation organiza-tion, today announced a scholar-ship program for university students. The program is aimed at focusing interest on the relationship of humans to other life forms as well as inducing student concern for the work of Congress. Annual scholarship swarfs in the age-create amount! stildent concern for the work of Congress. Annual scholarship awards in the aggregate amount of \$5.000 will be given those students who submit the finest essays in support of federal legislative campaign to end human exploitation of animals. The 1977-78 essay contest will center on the Williams-Long bill in the Congress which would ban the interstate shipment of furs from any state or nation which has not banned the legishold trap, the device used to cach and hold fire-bearers such as raccoon, bobeat, coyete and other animals wanted by the fur industry. The scholarship preserves

other animals wanted by the fur-industry.

The scholarship program was made possible by a grant from Regins Bauer Frankenberg, a director of FoA and president of its Washington lobby, the Com-mittee for Humane Legislation, within 100 the grant, she said, was the "engender concern for the environment and non-humans in young people." 
