For example, \$213 might be the fixed cost level for your farm. "Out of pocket expenses" such as fertilizer and pestides may run \$48.00. These costs total for a final production cost of \$261.00 per acre. Notice that \$1.6 percent of the cost were determined at the time it was decided to grow the crop.

150 bushels of corn at \$2.00 per bushel would produce a net profit of \$31.00 per acre, plus grazing profit should a produce rechoose to do so.

On the other hand, insufficient tertility and pest control could cut yields to 100 bushels. In this case your crop would be worth \$200 per acre, therefore a net loss and fixed cost at \$2.32 per acre, therefore a net loss of \$13.00.
