The City election and the Spearman Independent School District Board of Trustees election will be held April 1 at Spearman High School on April 1. Polls will open at 7 a.m. and close at 7 p.m.

To Meet**

A special meeting of the Palo Duro River Authority of Hansford County with representatives of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers involving discussion of the proposed Palo Duro River Project was in progress as this edition of The Spearman Reporter was going to press. The meeting began at 10 a.m. in the PDRA offices in the Hansford County Courthouse in Spearman. It was announced by Johnnie C. Lee, acting general manager of the PDRA.

Disaster Area Paperwork Forwarded

County Judge Johnnie C. Lee announced Monday, March 27, that the necessary paperwork connected with having Hansford County declared a disaster area has been completed and forwarded to Austin for further action. He noted that Governor Dolph Briscoe and other state officials contacted last week about the matter have expressed a favorable attitude concerning the situation.

Judge Lee accompanied by Bud Lowe traveled to Austin after Hansford County Commissioners Court voted unanimously Monday, March 20, to declare the county a disaster area.

In addition to accepting the status report on the disaster area declaration during the regular meeting of the Court on March 27, the Commissioners authorized the purchase of storm windows for the Courthouse and a replacement vehicle for the sheriff's department during the session held in the Courthouse in Spearman. The county will advertise for bids for the storm windows and the replacement vehicle.

Commissioners also authorized the purchase of radios for Gruber fire trucks with one

radio to be purchased from Precinct 4 funds and another from the County general fund. In addition, the city is expected to purchase some radios. The radios currently in use and being replaced will be utilized in weatherwatch service in the county.

The investment of \$15,000 in 90-day certificates of deposit for Investment Fund No. 13 for Precinct 2 was approved.

An annual service agreement on a cash register in the county tax office was approved and is to be handled by Stanfield Printing Co. of Guyton, Okla.

The tax office also was authorized an additional telephone number.

Payment of claims as presented was authorized. The meeting was recessed until Tuesday, March 28, at 2 p.m.

Small Engine School

Summer is in view with lawn mowers rolling out of winter hideaways. A small engine school taught by Fred Groves planned for Saturday, April 1st at the Spearman County Barn, is designed not to make you a mechanic, but to teach you how to diagnose and take care of the most common small engine problems.

From 9 a.m. to 12 noon and 1-4 p.m. anyone using lawn mowers, pumps or generators will learn how to avoid ruining an engine.

The school will include sharpening and balancing lawn mower blades, servicing engines, adjusting engine speeds, carburetor adjustments, safety, and proper air cleaner service which is the most common cause of ruined engines.

Fred will use torn down engines to exemplify the results of improper use and service. The school is designed for 4-H youth and adults. Anyone interested may attend free of charge, upon contacting the County Extension office to enroll (659-2030 or 733-2901).
