College Station, —an.—Free choice feeding of phenothiazin may someday help control cattle grubs but several problems re garding its use must first b solved.

Main drawback to phenothizine is its taste. Cattle do n like it and a practical way feed the product has not bee found.

Its future may hinge on whe ther research can "chocolate coat phenothiazine and guarantee the animals on the farm will con sume enough to produce a gru killing effect, says Dr. C. M Patterson, extension veterinarias

In preliminary tests, a definat drop in the number of grubs wa noted among cattle fed 2 gran of phenothiazine daily free-choic in protein supplement. "With need for further testing

no recommendations are bein made now," Dr. Patterson says If phenothiazine should prov an effective grub-killer, it would be a significant step in the con trol of the costly parasites

raisers in Texas are changing their ways to get the greatest returns from the least investment. The trend in brush control last year was toward cheaper methods which result in greater are control for each dollar spen but less precentage kilk.

And, in reseeding the turn was o cheaper, longer lasting menods using primary native grass arieties.

Cattlemen are changing their management to cope with drout and to meet demands for mor livestock products, says A. H Walker, extension range management specialist.

In a year-end summary of ange work in the state. Walker aws 3,974,451 acres of grassland underwent some type of land mprovement during the year. He standard that Extension Service lemonstrations in range managenent added \$1,767,415 to income of ranchers.

The demand for livestock products has increased 10 percent since drouth took its grip four years ago. Ranch units have increased in size and the number of livestock has declined in the central and western sections.

In some areas, higher livestock production and improved range conditions resulted from grazing livestock in combination. More efficient management, feeding and breeding of fewer livestock has brought about lower production costs. Walker adds.
