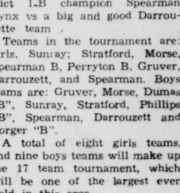

Snap-on Curtain Rings Save Time

One of the latest improvements on the market to save time for homemakers is a snap-on curtain ring. It is molded of tough nylon resin.

Mrs. Bernice Claytor, home management specialist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, says one of the principal advantages in using these rings is that they can be snapped off and on quickly and easily. The rings

are then released and your curtain is left in a flat piece which will be much easier to laundry or clean.

The rings are sturdy and light in weight because of the toughness and resiliency of nylon. These rings slide smoothly over the curtain rod making it easy to adjust the curtains.

Another advantage is that since there is no metal in the joint of the ring, you will not be troubled by corrosion or rust staining the fabric of your curtain.

The natural color of the rings is a milky white. However, they can be made to match any curtain color by boiling them in ordinary household dyes for a few minutes.

Daniel stated that he knew nothing about any organized movement on his behalf toward the governorship.

Oil Permit
 W. J. Murray Sr. has withdrawn a special drilling application because his son, W. J. Murray Jr., is a member of the Railroad Commission.

Application was made to the Commission by the senior Murray to allow him a special rule exception in drilling a new well in the North Glen Cove Field in Coleman County.

He said he withdrew the application after protests claimed the application would harm oil conservation in the field.

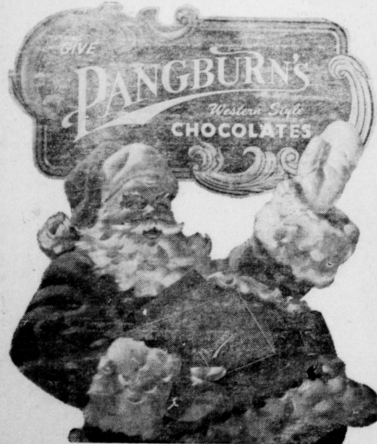

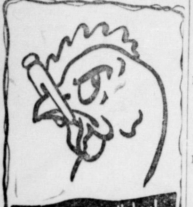

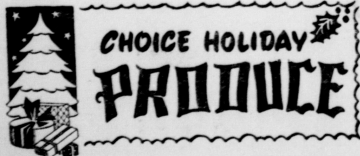
