Spruce Up Kitchen With Color, Order For Warm Weather

Kitchens in good order are especially inviting and restful. A few hours wisely spent can bring order to shelves and drawers, and this will save you many hours in meal preparation.

If it's not done already, organize the kitchen into the various centers of food preparation, mixing, refrigeration and dishwashing, then place all the supplies and equipment at these areas to save steps and time.

Aids to Order
That's all very good, you say, but space is at a premium. Well, then, there are several gadgets which may help to save space.

There are racks which will hold plates of all sizes, so that even a small shelf with a rack can hold a full set of plates. Cup racks are also small and will keep cups in order, or shell hooks may be installed.

For utensils, there are easily adjusted racks which will hold all lids to pots and pans. The racks slide in and out, and you can reach whichever lid you need easily without disturbing or moving the rest.

Pantry cluttered? Narrow shelves can usually be installed on the back of a door which will hold small items such as spice flavorings, small packages of puddings, cereal, etc.

Stain Stains
Most stains on enameled sinks of this kind can be removed with a mild abrasive. Rust stains can be removed best by treating with an acid. Vinegar or lemon juice may be used, but dilute hydrochloric acid (also known as "muriatic" acid) would be more effective. A bleaching solution, such as Javelle water (which is a solution in water of potassium chloride and hypochlorite), is generally quite effective in removing stains from an enamel.

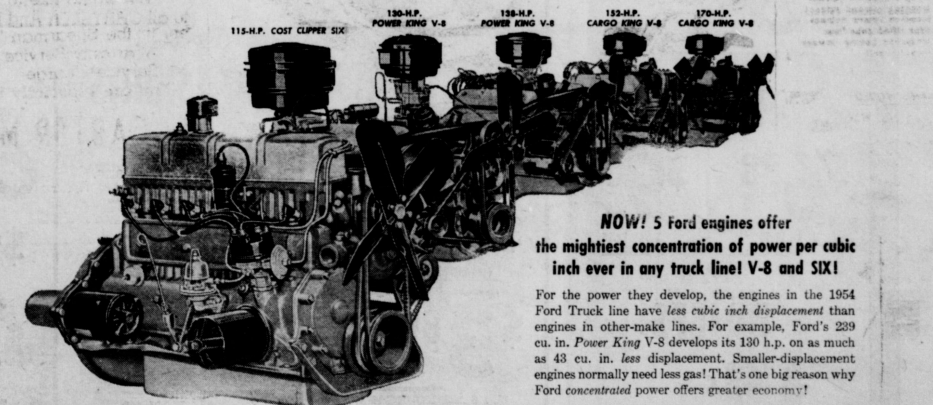




