The sharp increase in enrollment has necessitated these buildly \$210,000.00.

Subject to the election passing the Board has sold the bonds at an average interest rate of 2.45%. The bonds are to mature over a period of 10 years.

In order to secure the low 2.45% and to mature the bonds in a period of 10 years, the patrons of the school district are in bundles, for easier handling. being asked to vote on the proposition of accepting the newly created law, Senate Bill No. 116, passed by the Legislature this year. This bill provides that a School District may levy the usual \$1.50 tax rate for school maintenance, and also authorize the school district to vote bonds and levy for school maintenance, and also authorize the school district to vote bonds and levy additional tax for payment of these bonds. This will prove a savings of thousands of dollars in interest on bonds. When the bonds have been retired, the tax levy automatically ceases.
