The home place was purchased from Jack Borger, who served strictly as a home for the well liked

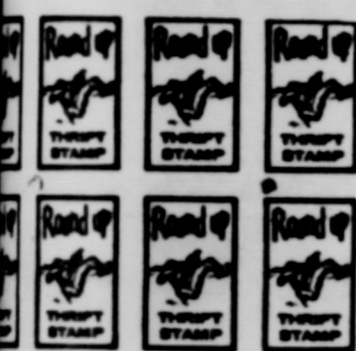

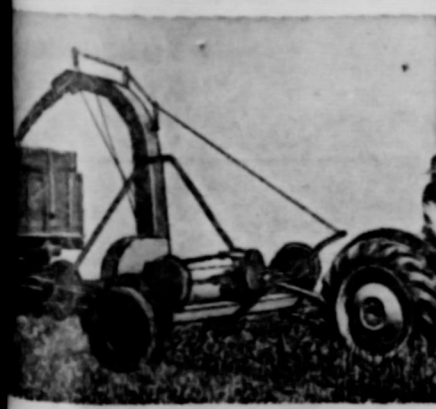
