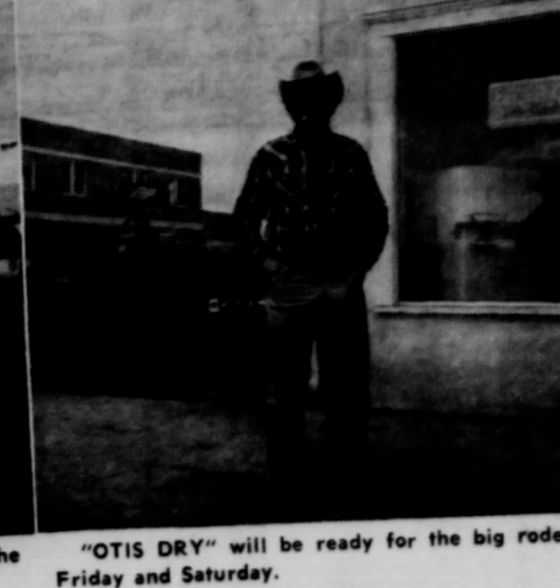

290 Million Cubic Feet Gasser Brought In On Jack Taylor Farm Near Spearman

Best Producer Of Anadarcite Gas Located Within 5 Miles City Limits Of Spearman

While there has not been an official Railroad Commission appraisal of the gas potential of the Jack Taylor No. 1, it is estimated to be a 290 million cubic feet gasser. The well is a dual completion from the Harrow and Ireland sands and the invasion we have is that the well is open to the surface for this largest of all gas producers in this area is 290 million cubic feet.

New Post Office Opens

The new Spearman Post Office will be opened Friday, April 25, at 9:00 a. m.

First plans for the new building were formulated in August, 1956.

The new location, 304 Hancock street, is across the street from the location of the first Post Office when Spearman was established in 1919.

The new building is 38' x 60'. The owner of the building is Kenneth G. Kohler of Amarillo, Texas. The general contractor is W. C. Humphrey, Amarillo.

The building will contain 816 new lock boxes and all other equipment is being installed new. It will feature the new modern bank type finance counters.

The old building was occupied for a period of ten years and 9 months. It originally had 581 lock boxes. In February 1956, 135 additional boxes were added and they were rented within a period of 3 months.

The gross postal receipts in 1947 were \$25,515.50 (109 per cent increase).

There are three star routes covering 150 miles and serving 105 boxes out of this office. The carriers are J. W. Douglas, W. S. Chambers and Phillip J. Dow.

Postmaster Donald H. Smith was appointed February 15, 1954. There are two carrier regular clerks, Ray Robertson and Paul Hazlewood; one carrier substitute clerk, Kenneth Bailey; and one temporary substitution clerk, Cliff Douglas.

The officials that are to be present for the dedication are J. Mel Benesch, Field Service officer, 2nd. Postal District of Amarillo, Texas; V. E. Bell, Post office Real estate officer, Lubbock; and A. W. Pfanmiller, Postal Inspector, Amarillo.

Since 1919 the Post Office has been in four locations. The first was back of the P. M. Maize and Company store. Later it was moved to Main street next to the Burran store. For the past almost 11 years it has been housed in the building recently vacated.

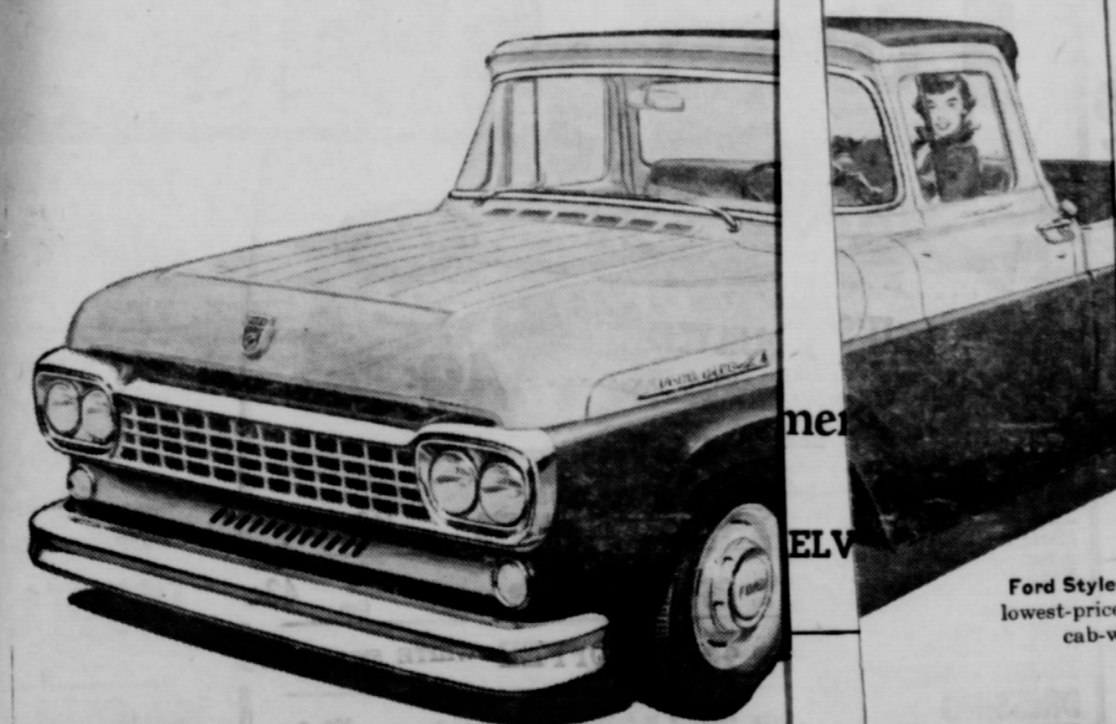

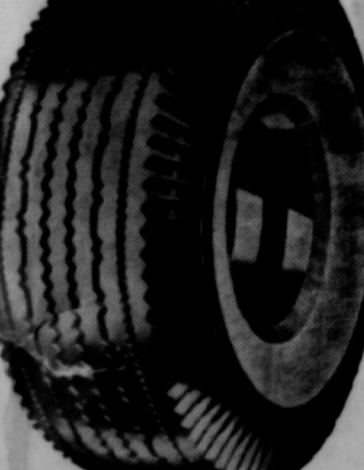

TIME TO FIGHT CANCER

This is Cancer Control Month, the annual occasion for the American Cancer Society's Cancer Crusade. This great public service organization is the only voluntary health agency fighting cancer in three fronts — through research designed to find new methods of cure for this disease and service to cancer patients. It, professional and public education, and in the attack on man's cruelest enemy. In the last twenty years more progress has been made in understanding cancer than all the previous history of mankind. This is largely due to the fine assistance volunteers in the April Crusade, both men and women, have given to the ACS. There are nearly two million Cancer Crusaders.

More people die of cancer each year, but more are being saved from it. Until the spring of 1956, statisticians estimated that one in four Americans who had cancer was being cured. At the Third National Cancer Conference in Detroit in June, 1956, it was disclosed that one in three was being saved. From one-in-four to one-in-three means that some 38,000 lives are being saved annually which would have been lost to cancer a decade ago. In all, about 150,000 are saved in this country each year. That is heartening, but physicians agree that one in two—half of those who develop cancer, or 225,000—could be saved today by earlier diagnosis and prompt treatment.

The Society has led the way to the greatest research attack ever launched against a single disease, and has devoted nearly \$60,000,000 to research since World War II. Its spokesmen have been leaders in persuading Congress to appropriate large sums for this work.

The American Cancer Society is not a permanent organization. It is working hard to put itself out of business. It will last only until cancer is conquered. Public contributions to enable the Society to carry on its attack have mounted from less than a million dollars in 1944 to more than \$29,000,000 in 1957. To continue this accelerating attack, the Society relies on its independent fund-raising and the 1958 goal: \$30,000,000. Certainly the ACS, in seeking that goal deserves all possible support from the public.

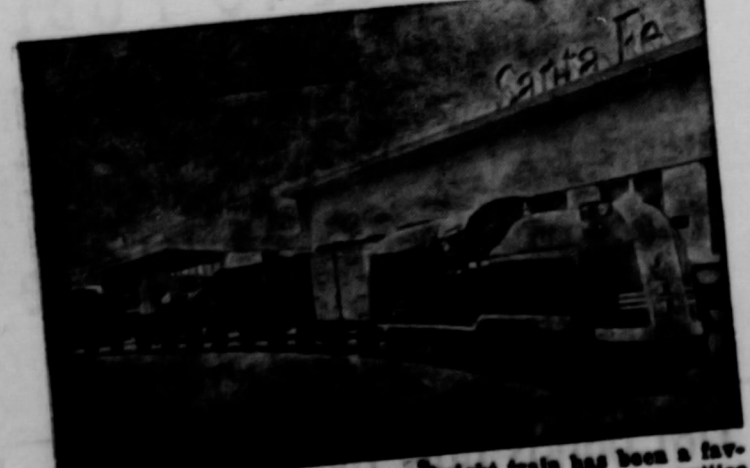

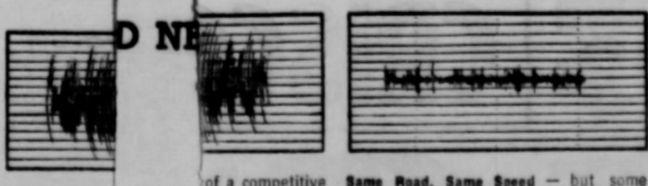

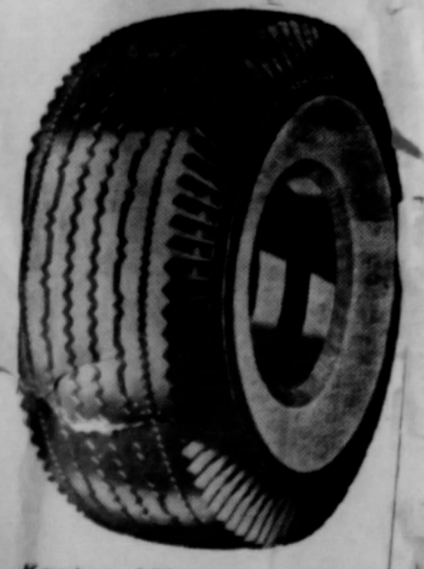

Officers At Ranch

Peace officers from a five-state area will hold their fifth annual United Peace Officers of America convention Thursday, May 8, at Cal Farley's famous Boys Ranch.

The organization was formed in 1953 for the purpose of helping to raise funds for a school building at Boys Ranch, and since that time the peace officers have continued their interest in this unique home for homeless and so-called delinquent boys.

Members of United Peace Officers of America include all Texas highway patrolmen, sheriff's departments and city law enforcement officers as well as peace officers from every state in the union and parts of Canada.

Because members of UOPA recognized that Boys Ranch was rehabilitating boys who in many instances otherwise might have become problems for their own departments to handle, the organization, in its first resolution, stated one of its chief aims was to assist in the building program at the Ranch. As a result of their first campaign, sufficient money was raised to begin construction on Boys Ranch Independent School and, with other help, the school was completed in 1955.

The building, fireproof structure of steel and Colorado stone, has three wings and is built to accommodate 500 boys, the eventual goal of the Ranch. Wings consist of the grade school wing, where there are seven classrooms and a library; the high school wing, with five classrooms, a library and audio-visual room; and the vocational wing, where the science laboratory, barber shop and six classrooms are located.

In addition to the regular curriculum, the school offers extensive vocational training for its 236 students. It is a fully accredited, 12-grade system, employing 15 teachers.

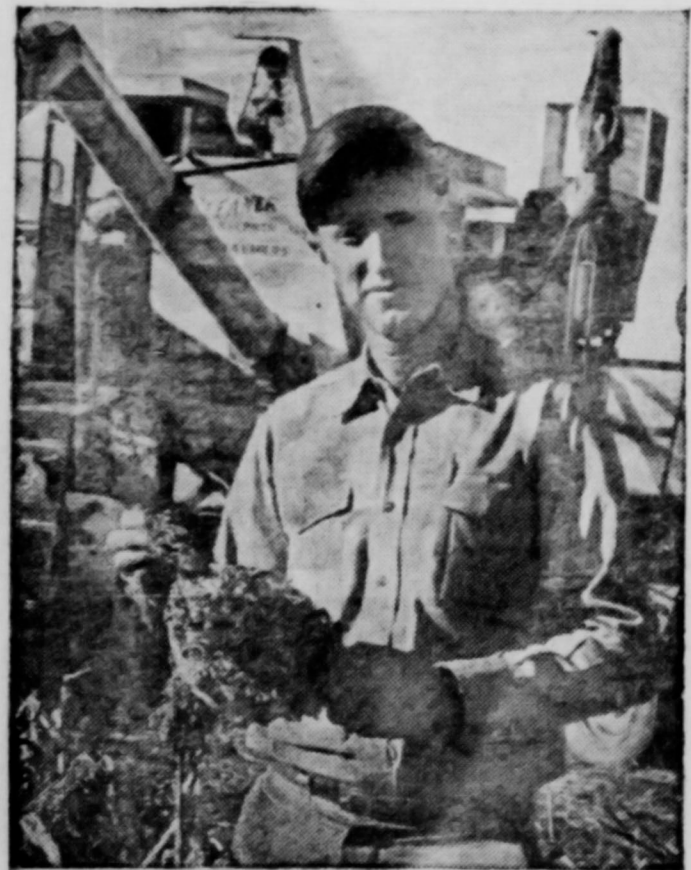

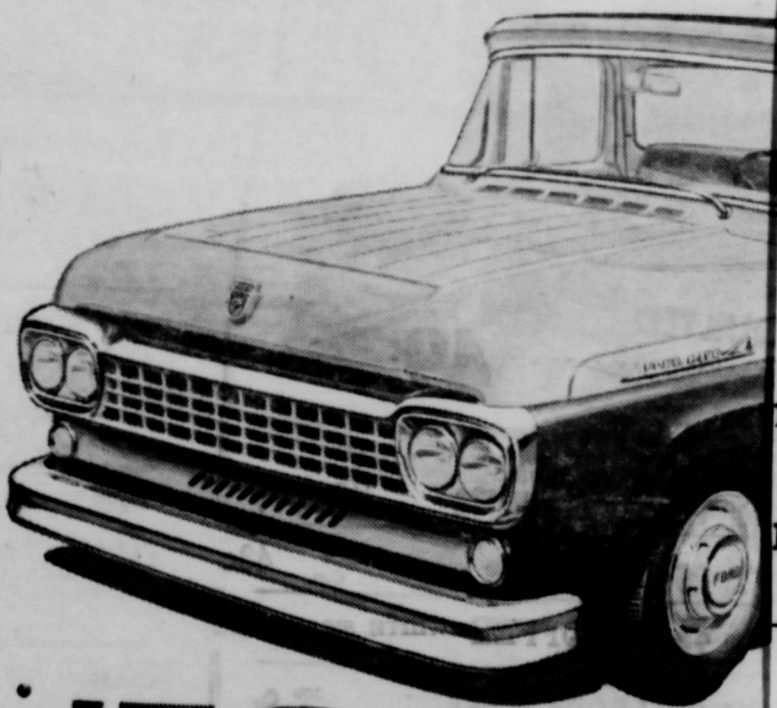

Officers At Ranch
Peace officers from a five-state area will hold their fifth annual United Peace Officers of America convention Thursday, May 8, at Cal Farley's famous Boys Ranch.

The organization was formed in 1953 for the purpose of helping to raise funds for a school building at Boys Ranch, and since that time the peace officers have continued their interest in this unique home for homeless and so-called delinquent boys.

Members of United Peace Officers of America include all Texas highway patrolmen, sheriff's departments and city law enforcement officers as well as peace officers from every state in the union and parts of Canada.

Because members of UOPA recognized that Boys Ranch was rehabilitating boys who in many instances otherwise might have become problems for their own departments to handle, the organization, in its first resolution, stated one of its chief aims was to assist in the building program at the Ranch. As a result of their first campaign, sufficient money was raised to begin construction on Boys Ranch Independent School and, with other help, the school was completed in 1955.

The building, fireproof structure of steel and Colorado stone, has three wings and is built to accommodate 500 boys. Wings consist of the grade school wing, where there are seven classrooms and a library; the high school wing, with five classrooms, a library and audio-visual room; and the vocational wing, where the science laboratory, barber shop and six classrooms are located.

Washington News Letter From Congressman Walter Rogers

CUBA
Persons, representing themselves as former Members of the Congress, have sent a memorandum to the Members of the United States Congress. This memorandum includes statements of a serious nature, insofar as the second paragraph of the letter is a follows: "The United States Government is supporting the ruthless dictatorship of Batista's dictatorship, which is favoring world freedom and democracy. The belief in the terrible civil war is impairing the prestige and will of the United States."

It will note that the statement in that paragraph is a distortion of the actual facts; however, this paragraph is followed by another paragraph containing four subheadings to document support. A close observation of the matter contained in the four paragraphs reveals the assumption that the document is a distortion of the actual facts. Information has been sent by one Dr. Lincoln Rodon, Alton Road, Miami Beach, Fla., and he is joined by 9 others. The gravity of the charges certainly warrant a full investigation by the Department of State, the Department of Justice, and the Department of Defense.

The Reorganization of the Defense Department:
The President's proposal to reorganize the Defense Department works on Capitol Hill. There is a decided division of opinion as to the role that should be played by civilians in the military setup. It is accepted that the military has always been jealous of what it considers its jurisdiction. This applies not only to the military as a whole, but to the several departments of the military, to wit, the Army, the Air Force and the Navy. In fact, there have been rumors of jealousies cropping up between the different branches of each of the departments. It is these inter-service rivalries that could be the major factor prompting the President's new proposal. It will be remembered that it was only a few years ago that our military establishment was reorganized into the Office of Secretary of Defense created. This new office was given cabinet status and replaced the former Secretary of War and Secretary of the Navy. That reorganization was supposed to answer all of the inter-service problems and unify under one command the operations of our military. The purpose to be accomplished was a more effective military operation at less cost to the taxpayer.

It has been argued many times that unification was not accomplished by that reorganization and that costs were not reduced but increased; that the actual results was nothing more than the creation of a new and additional department of the military. It would certainly be safe to say that the sought after result was not accomplished by the previous reorganization; otherwise, there

Tularemia
I thought the only way to contract tularemia (rabbit fever) is in the handling of infected rabbits until I read an article in the March issue of Texas Game and Fish. The article was written by Grant Burton of the Texas State Health Department. It really gives the low-down on this disease. Parts of the story will be related.

"A 28-year-old McLennan County farmer was in excellent health when he cleaned a rabbit he had shot in his pasture. At that time he had a small abrasion on his left index finger. Two days later the finger was sharply painful and swollen. Seven days later he was admitted to a hospital, with a fever of 103 and painful, movable lump the size of a lemon under his left arm. A victim of tularemia.

"A quail hunter scratched his hand on a sharp bone as he sat cleaning his kill. Within a week he was hospitalized with tularemia pneumonia.

"Tularemia has been and is prevalent over all of Texas. Hunters and outdoorsmen are more susceptible than the general population, because of greater opportunities of exposure. Well over 600 cases have been reported in this state since 1946, and that figure is undoubtedly on a small fraction of the actual number."

"Today we know that tularemia is capable of infecting almost all species of Texas wildlife, from deer to field mice. There is a broad range of insect vectors or carriers of the disease, with ticks being most important in spreading the disease from sick rodent to unwary human.

"A 21-year-old Williamson County housewife found a tick embedded in her leg. Five days later her left eye and eyelid were swollen shut, and she was admitted to a hospital, weak and feverish. She could not recall having been in contact with any animals. And she was not aware of getting anything in her eye. Apparently the tick was the transmitting agent."

From what has been said so far by Mr. Burton, it would appear dangerous to take to the outdoors for almost any reason and especially to hunt wild game, but in closing the article reads:

"According to authorities in the field, 90 percent of human cases of tularemia throughout the nation are acquired from rabbits—chiefly cottontails. Interestingly, domestic rabbits have been known to develop the disease naturally. As for other domestic animals, natural infections have been found in cats, dogs, hogs, and sheep. Cows and horses apparently are immune. Susceptible wild birds include quail, chicken hawks and horned owls—all common to Texas."

Mr. Burton further stated: Our object is most certainly not to discourage hunting, fishing or hiking. A theme of soul-satisfying beauty runs throughout the whole article.

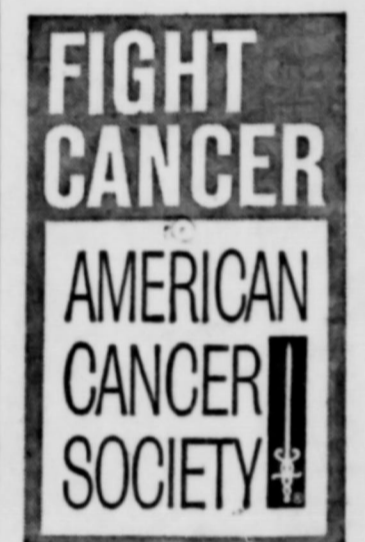
Revival Services In Progress At Union Church
