Imported Oil Price Beats West Texas Crude By 57 Cents Barrel

It's cheaper to import crude oil to the U. S. East Coast by 50 to 80 cents a barrel. That's the figure of John E. Swearingen, executive vice-president of the Standard Oil Co. (Ind) this week. The differential, meanwhile is the reason the new voluntary program to limit crude oil imports faces trouble as shown during the past few days. Crude oil from the Middle East can be landed at the U. S. East Coast at least 57 cents a barrel less than West Texas crude, Swearingen said. The saving is 54 cents as the minimum for Venezuelan crude. Saving, he said, is based on price of \$2.84 for West Texas crude oil of 31.8 degree gravity plus pipe line charges of 26.9 cents and a tanker rate to the East Coast of 28.5 cents. Middle East crude he said costs \$1.85 a Kuwait and the tanker rate is 97.1 cents and the import duty 10.5 cents for a total of \$2.92. Venezuela crude costs \$2.65 a barrel and the tanker rate is 19.4 cents plus duty of 10.5 cents for a total of \$2.94 cents. Average U. S. price may be higher than the Swearingen figure, and this would make the spread that much greater. Further, he said, discounts up to 25 cents a barrel have been given on foreign crudes, adding that much more. Middle East and Venezuelan crudes can and are being delivered on the East Coast at 50 to 80 cents per barrel less than



One dove this year where we had ten last year? One dove hunter this fall where we had five last fall? That is somewhat the picture from this corner. However there seems to be more doves in the country now than before the season opened yesterday afternoon. I noticed at least forty in one cottonwood. In certain areas there are many doves but unlike last year they are not in the high places. Along the river and the creeks, they are found. Last week Earl Walker, Director of Wildlife Restoration, Texas Game and Fish Commission and a couple of other wildlife Biologists noted two dove nests that contained four young birds. The nests were along the Canadian river in some button willow trees. This find was not at all unusual for this part of the country and for this time of the year. The peak of the nesting season passed in early Aug. It usually tapers off and by the middle of September there will be practically no doves nesting in this area. Dove hunters should be particularly careful while walking through weedy and grass due to the fact that rattlesnakes are on the move this time of the year. Last Saturday Jim Whitlock, Borker, killed a large one on the Turkey Track Ranch. Bob Shelton Killed another large one on Smokehouse creek on Sunday and while Lindsey killed a eight rattle. More on the Herring Ranch. More snakes have been killed the last ten days than all summer. The diamond back rattler is the ONLY poisonous snake that is found in the Panhandle. Many sportsmen will swear that some of the Natrix water snakes are water moccasins. These snakes do resemble the deadly cottonmouth. According to Al Flury, Texas Game and Fish in Texas and in the United States we have only four general types of poisonous snakes: the rattlesnake, coral snakes, copperhead and cottonmouth water moccasins. Each kind has distinctive coloring, making, body shape, habits or other characteristics which can be seen easily and used to differentiate the poisonous and non-poisonous snakes. Mr. Flury also states the main point to remember about snake bite is that unless cornered, stepped on, or otherwise restrained, almost any snake will try to escape

HOW BILL STOPPED FUMBLING THE BALL. The power to believe is the greatest force in a human being. Faith and fear are both a form of believing. Here's a man whose life has been dogged by sickness, frustration and failure. Someone tries to encourage him by saying, "Don't be afraid. God will help you." He cries, "No, I don't believe. He will. I do not believe anything can help me." Therefore, his fear is a form of belief. He believes God can't help him. Faith is believing also. Faith is based upon confidence in God and His power to protect and deliver us. This kind of believing brings that feeling of security. It relaxes the muscles. It removes the knot of fear from the stomach. It controls the emotions and calms the mind. Bill Thomas was a young high school student and his greatest ambition was to be a football player. In his Junior year, he went out for the team. His tackling was vicious. His courage in meeting any situation was outstanding. He played the position of halfback and carried the ball very often. One day early in the career when the center snapped the ball rather hard, he fumbled. From that hour an insistent fear plagued him whenever the ball was to come to him. Always he would think "What if I fumble, what if I drop the ball?" When he was carrying back punts down the field, the same fear would nag him. And he did begin fumbling the ball often. Finally the coach told him that if he kept on fumbling, he would have to take him off the team. But the coach was a rather keen student of human nature. He took young Bill aside, and this is what he said, "Bill, I know that you are not afraid. Your tackling is too hard and you face the biggest of opponents without one quiver of fear, I would rather have you between an enemy ball carrier and our goal line than anyone else I know. Now, tell me why you drop the ball." Then Bill told him of his first experience and of the awful fear that kept seizing upon him every time he was called to carry the ball—the fear of fumbling. Then the coach said quietly, "Bill, I want to talk to you and then you talk to yourself. You simply have begun to believe that you are going to fumble. Now, I want you to change your form of believing. From now on whenever the ball is coming to you, I want you to say with a determination and believe it, 'I will catch the ball; I will not fumble; I will carry the ball!' Then ask God to help you—and He will." From that moment on, Bill never fumbled again. He became one of the best players in the state. He changed his believing.
