

Farmers Tax Filing Requirements

If you are a farmer who earned at least two-thirds of your 1964 gross income from farming, you should file your estimated 1964 Federal income tax return on or before Friday, January 15, 1965, according to Hubert Hamill Administrative Officer of the Amarillo office of Internal Revenue Service. You should use Form 1040-ES in filing this return.

However, you do not need to file this estimate if you file your final return on Form 1040 and pay in full any tax due by February 15, 1965.

"Farmer's Tax Guide," which furnishes detailed information on this subject, is available upon request from the Internal Revenue Service.
