WHY DO I FEEL GUILTY

Mr. A. was a successful young business and Civic leader. His life was miserable from morning until night. He went to his doctor who soon found his problem beyond the reash of medcine or surgery. He advised him to go to his pastor. "Your trouble is Spiritual". Mr. A wept as he unburdened his soul in the pastor's study. The burden of unforgiving sin was smothering his life.

They should realize that the teachings of Jesus concerning forgiveness apply to every area of life. Peter asked Jesus, "How oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him?" Jesus answered him, "Until seventy times seven" (Matt. 18:21-22). There is no limit to the number of times that God forgives. Jesus himself is the means of that forgivness. "The Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins" (Mark 2:10). The forgiveness is final. "As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgresions from us" (Psalms 103:12).






