For those of you who have lots of tomatoes and don't want to can them, you now can successfully tomatoes. Its' still true that fresh ripe tomatoes do not freeze well. But they may be frozen, either stewed or as juice.

Here's how: FOR JUICE - wash, sort and trim vine-ripered tomatoes. Cut in qua rters or eights, and simmer 5 to 10 minutes. Press through a sieve Season with a teaspoon salt to each quart of juice. Pour into freezing containers with wide top opening, allowing 1 inch space at top of each quart. Seal



NOTICE IRRIGATION WELL OWNERS
