Must Register For 1967 Vote

oting was held invalid in Feb uary of this year by a three udge federal court. It based its uling on the due process clause of the Federal Constitution. The ourt said this requirement was quivalent to a charge or penalty mposed on the exercise of a fun lamental right, & it indicated hat any charge for registration rould be illegal. The United States Supreme Court affirmed he decision.

Immediately following the three udge decision the State Legisature was called into special sesion and it adopted a new regis ration act. The major change in he law was that registration with he County Tax Collector should e without charge.

Under the law passed in Feb uary voters will register an nually, as they have previously done, during the period of October 1 through January 31. A emporary registration was alowed in March 1966, but this vas a one-time provision only.

You do not have to pay a poll ax now, but you must register The time to do this is now. To be eligible to vote in 1967 elecions, you must go by the Counv Tax Office and register. Dead ine date is January 31.

Everyone from the age of 21 years through 60 must register in order to vote. If you are over 60, you are exempt.






