## Studies Of Small Towns Will Include Spearman

Spearman is among 15 West Texas towns of less than 12,000 population which have been chosen for pilot studies of small towns by the West Texas Chamber of Commerce.  
"We want to determine what assets of these small towns have," said C. L. Cooke of Fort Worth, chairman of the Small Town Task Force of the WTCC — "what they have to offer people to live there, to continue to live there and to move there and what their problems are."  
This Friday, December 2 at 10 a. m. members of Cooke's committee will meet in the Farm Bureau room in Spearman at 10 a. m. Dick Countiss, local director of the WTCC, will be in charge and will explain the pilot study.  
At this meeting, questionnaires will be completed including all information about educational facilities, industrial potential, recreation, cultural activities, tourism, medical facilities, convention facilities, water supply, transportation, natural resources, special events such as fairs and celebrations, agriculture and ranching, taxes, news media and banking, according to Cooke.  
The towns in which pilot studies are to be conducted were chosen by the individual committee members who will conduct the studies. These studies will be complete within 3 weeks.  
In February six hearings will be held to discuss the findings of the larger-scale studies.

A 54 year old Gruver man remains in critical condition in the Northwest hospital this week suffering from head injuries received Sunday when his pickup truck hit a culvert about 2 miles west of Gruver on US 289.  
Clarence Hall, a farm laborer was taken to Hansford Hospital for emergency treatment and later was transferred to Northwest Hospital in Amarillo.  
Hansford County Deputy Sheriff O. V. Walker said he was told that Hall was taken from the scene of the accident to his home at Gruver by a passerby and that a friend took him from there to the hospital in Spearman.  
Walker said the pickup truck in which Hall had been riding, was traveling west when it hit a culvert on the South side of the highway, went through a fence & crashed into an irrigation ditch. The truck did not turn over, but the rear wheels were almost torn off.
