This proposal will not be voted be held over until the general etection in November, 1938. <br> Now all but one of the six amendments to come before the State wide interest and they de serve the thoughtful attention of Texas voters. Unfortunately, it is probably true that a very great many qualified voters will not trouble themselves, either to study these proposed amendments or to go to the polls to vote on them. Admittedly, it is difficul enough at any time to arouse interest of Texans to vote on proposed changes in their fundamental law and that task becomes more difficult each year. <br> These amendments are important. At least some of them represent trends in government that were hardly thought of only a few years ago. They should be earnestly considered for that reason lif for no other. <br> Special Drouth Resisting Seed Wheat Available <br> Local wheat producers are attempting a pool purchase of the special drouth resisting wheat seed, the famous Tenmarq seed wheat. This wheat is available at $\$ 2.25$ per bushel at the government experiment station at Denton, Texas. The wheat has been tried out thoroughly in this section as well as in Kansas, and has been found to be an excellent producer, able to withstand adversities probably better than any other varieties. <br> - It would be very expensive to try and seed an entire crop with this expensive wheat, but a small acreage planted for future seed is the plan of local wheat growers. <br> If sufficient number will join the pool a truck can be sent from Hansford county to Denton, and the cost of freight will be small.
