Rationing Calendar To Sept. 3

War Ration Book I Sugar: Stamp 14 became valid August 16, expires Nov. 1. Nos. 15 and 16, for canning, good for five pounds each through October 31. Shoes: Stamp No. 18 good until October 31, inclusive. War Ration Book II Blue Stamps (Canned fruit, canned vegetables, fruit juices, soup, frozen food, catsup, etc.) R, S, and T became valid August 1, now expire on September 20. U and V become valid on September 1 and expire October 20. Red Stamps (Meat, canned meat, butter, margarine, lard, cheese, canned fish, fats, oil and canned milk): X became valid August 22; Y becomes valid August 29; and Z becomes valid September 5; all expire October 2.

War Ration Book III Brown Stamps become valid for meats on September 12.

Gasoline Gasoline coupons must be endorsed on the front immediately upon receipt. Car owners still holding old type "B" and "C" gasoline ration books should exchange for new mileage ration sheets of coupons between August 23 and September 11. No. 7 "A" coupons now good for 3 gals. each through September 21. "B" and "C" good for 3 gals. each. "D" good for 1 1/2 gals. each. "E" good for 1 gal. each. "R" and "T" good for 5 gals. each. "B", "C", "E", & "R" issued for 3 months with any coupons left over valid for further use.

Tire Inspection "A" book holders must have second official inspection by September 30; "B" book holders, third inspection by October 31; and "C" book holders, third inspection by August 31; "T" book holders, second inspection within 6 months of last date of inspection or every 5,000 miles, whichever comes first. Speedometer reading should be written in on record.

NOTICE OF REVENUE BOND ELECTION THE STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF HANSFORD CITY OF SPEARMAN To the resident, qualified, property taxpaying voters of the City of Spearman, Texas: Take notice that an election will be held in the City of Spearman, Texas, on the 15th day of September, 1943, on the proposition and at the place more particularly set forth in the order of election adopted by the city commission on the 18th day of August, 1943, which is as follows:

Resolution and Order By the city commission of the City of Spearman, Texas, calling an election on the question of the issuance of revenue bonds of said city in the amount of \$51,000.00, for the purpose of securing funds with which to acquire a gas plant and distribution system serving the city of Spearman and its inhabitants and territory adjacent to said city; mortgaging said system, and pledging the revenues of said system for the payment thereof.

Whereas, the city commission deems it advisable and to the best interest of the City of Spearman to acquire a gas plant and distribution system serving said city and its inhabitants and territory adjacent to said city; and Whereas, it is considered to be to the best interest of the city that such system be financed by the issuance of revenue bonds payable solely from and secured by an exclusive first lien on and pledge of the revenues of the said gas plant and distribution system, and further secured by a first mortgage upon the real estate, fixtures and chattel property of said system, acquired or to be acquired, and by the pledge of an operating franchise to operate said system in event of foreclosure, all in accordance with the provisions of Articles 1111-1118, both inclusive, of the 1925 Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, as amended, and in no wise supported by an ad valorem or other tax on property in the city; and Whereas, the city commission deems it advisable and proper that the question of the issuance of such revenue bonds and the pledging of such revenues and the mortgaging of said system be submitted to the qualified electors of said city;

Therefore, be it resolved and ordered by the city commission of the City of Spearman, Texas: 1. That an election be held on the 15th day of September, 1943, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted: Proposition Shall the city commission of

the City of Spearman, Texas, be authorized to issue \$51,000.00 Revenue Bonds of said city, maturing serially over a period of years not to exceed ten (10) years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed four (4%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, for the purpose of securing funds with which to acquire a gas plant and distribution system serving the City of Spearman and its inhabitants and territory adjacent to said city; said bonds to be issued in accordance with and secured in the manner provided by Articles 1111-1118, both inclusive, of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of 1925, as amended; said bonds to be secured by a pledge of the net revenues from the operation of the system; and further secured by a gas plant and distribution system mortgage on the properties of said system and a pledge of a franchise to operate said system for a term not to exceed twenty (20) years in the event foreclosure is necessary; each bond to be conditioned that the holder thereof shall never have the right to demand payment of said obligation out of any funds raised or to be raised by taxation.

2. That said election shall be held at the City Hall building, within said city, and the following named persons are hereby appointed managers thereof, to-wit: O. C. Roney, presiding judge, J. D. Hester, assistant judge, Mrs. Sid Clark, clerk, Mrs. Gene Cline, clerk.

3. That said election shall be held under the provisions of and in accordance with the laws governing the issuance of municipal bonds by cities, as provided in the General Laws of the State of Texas, and only qualified electors, who own taxable property in the city and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be qualified to vote.

The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following: "For the issuance of gas system revenue bonds, and the mortgaging of the system and the pledging of the revenues and income of said system to the payment thereof."

"Against the issuance of gas system revenue bonds, and the mortgaging of the system and the pledging of the revenues and income of said system to the payment thereof."

Each voter shall mark out with black ink or black pencil one of the above expressions, thus leaving the other as indicating his vote.

4. That a copy of this resolution and order, signed by the mayor of said city and attested by the city secretary, shall serve as proper notice of said election.

5. The mayor is authorized and directed to cause this notice of election to be posted at three public places within said city, one of which shall be at the City Hall and one of which shall be at the place designated for holding said election, for at least fifteen (15) full days prior to the date of said election.

6. The mayor is further authorized and directed to cause this notice of election to be published in some newspaper of general circulation published in said city, on the same day in each of two

successive weeks, the date of first publication to be not less than fourteen (14) full days prior to the date of said election. Passed and approved this the 18th day of August, 1943. (Seal) E. C. WOMBLE, Mayor, City of Spearman, Texas. Attest: LEO DACUS, City Secretary 21-Aug. 26-Sept. 2.
