That was the word at press time from both the financial community and agricultural authorities The moisture that fell ahe ad of the snow -- proing the perfect "binder" between the white gold
the thirsty earth --varied across the county but was not measured at less than an inch at any point and a number of rural points reported an un official one and one-half inches of certain moisture.
Assessment of moisture in inches from the snow varies from person to person but that is because snow varies -- wet or dry -- and gradients in be tween. The differences of opinion are nothing to bring any pessimism, however, because the concensus is between .12 to .15 inch per inch of snow fall.
So, there should be well over an inch of sure wet from the seven-inch blanket spread over the county -- or nearly three inches of total precip for the wet start of the week. Those figures are unoficial estimates. The official weather people always await a more scientific determination of total wet after a snow.
Along with the promise of bright hope for the next crop, there were the usual expletives from the man in the street about the deep snow. (The are called "expletives" up to 10 inches of snow After that, they became plain ol' cuss words!) However the loudest and most frequent voice heard were in praise of Mayor Ralph Blodgett and the city council and City Manager Jim Murray and his corps of city employees who turned so motorist the deep drits in city streets so motorist and pedestrian alike moved more safely and more comfortably.
So, while most of the nation is watching the changing of the guard" at the White House, in Hansford County where folks live by the land, yes and hopes are on the weather.
