kin. Wash clothes worn while applying pesticides daily or sotore them in a plastic bag to owawait
laundering. Do not mix contaminated clothes with ther laundry. Normal hearily soled laundry
eemove pesticide from clothing.
Follow this procedure:
Use hot wash water, $130-140$ degrees F. and
normal or full water level. Presoak or prewash for extra heavily soiled garments.
Use the manufacturer's recommended amount of heary-duty detergent for heavily soiled
leundry Use chlorine bleach to aid in sanitizing and
deodorizing if garments are bleachable. Check permanent-care labels for warnings against
beaching Thoroughly rinse with cold water.
If possible, thoroughly dry in an automatic dry at the regular fabric setting.
Remove any leftover pesticic
Remove any leftover pesticide from the washer
by running the machine through the complete by running the machine through the complete
leundering cycle, using detergent but no clothes.
